

oralmost two years, Shriners Children's patients have implored the public to Watch Me, in commercials airing throughout the United States – "watch me" play football, dance, surf, swim, cheer, play basketball and more. Thanks to the care and specialized prosthetic device he received from Shriners Children's, Parker is now back to playing the sports he loves and is featured playing football in the commercial.


Shriners Children's St. Louis is in need of "ON CALL" Van Drivers and Riders to pick up patients and bring them to/ from the hospital. The normal
