

To all excuses, God will respond with something like this: "Sorry, wrong answer. I created, saved, and called you. Then I commanded you to live a life of service. What part did you not understand?"

The Bible warns unbelievers, "He will pour out his anger and wrath on those who live for themselves" (Romans 2:8). And Christians who live for themselves will lose eternal rewards.

The Bible says that you're only fully alive when you're helping others. "If you insist on saving your life, you will lose it. Only those who throw away their lives for my sake and for the sake of the Good News will ever know what it means to really live" (Mark 8:35).

Then he repeats a similar truth twice in the book of Matthew and twice in Luke:

- "If you cling to your life, you will lose it; but if you give it up for me, you will save it" (Matthew 10:39).
- •"For anyone who keeps his life for himself shall lose it; and anyone who loses his life for me shall find it again" (Matthew 16:25).
- "Whoever loses his life for my sake will save it, but whoever insists on keeping his life will lose it" (Luke 9:24).

Did you catch that? This truth is so important that it is repeated five times in the Gospels. If you are not serving, you are just existing—because life is meant for ministry.

What does God expect from you? He wants you to learn to love and serve others unselfishly.

Michael Heuer





Shriners Children's Recognized Five Times for Orthopedics by U.S. News & World Report



hriners Children's has once again been ranked nationally for orthopedics in the 2022-2023 Best Children's Hospitals rankings published by U.S. News & World Report, the global authority in hospital rankings and consumer advice.

The Best Children's Hospitals rankings, which highlight the top 50 centers in 10 pediatric specialties, are designed to help families of children with rare or life-threatening illnesses find the best medical care available. Now in their 16th year, the rankings include new measures for diversity, equity and inclusion.

The following Shriners Hospitals ranked in pediatric orthopedics:

- #10 Shriners Children's St. Louis
 - (in partnership with St. Louis Children's Hospital Washington University)
- #19 Shriners Children's Northern California
 - (in partnership with UC Davis Children's Hospital)
- #27 Shriners Children's Erie
 - (in partnership with UPMC Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh)
- #31- Shriners Children's Salt Lake City
 - (in partnership with Intermountain Primary Children's Hospital-University of Utah)
- #45 Shriners Children's Lexington
 - (in partnership with Kentucky Children's Hospital)

The hospitals were ranked in pediatric orthopedics for treatment of conditions such as scoliosis and spina bifida, and injuries such as complex fractures or other sports injuries. Success with complex fractures, surgical complications and infection prevention accounted for most of each hospital's score.

"We are extremely excited by the 2022 U.S. News & World Report rankings," said Frances A. Farley, M.D., chief medical officer of Shriners Children's. "We would like to thank all who participated in the process, and congratulate our ranked pediatric orthopedic programs, along with their affiliates."

To create the pediatric rankings, U.S. News & World Report gathers key clinical data through a detailed survey that looks at measures such as patient safety, infection prevention and adequacy of nurse staffing. In addition, part of each hospital's score is derived from surveys of more than 15,000 pediatric specialists who are asked where they would send the sickest children in their specialty. In 2022, only 90 children's hospitals were ranked in at least one of the 10 pediatric specialties evaluated.

This year's rankings will be published in the U.S. News & World Report's Best Hospitals 2023 Guidebook, available in stores Oct. 5, 2022.

"Choosing the right hospital for a sick child is a critical decision for many parents. The Best Children's Hospitals rankings spotlight hospitals that excel in specialized care, offering parents and their pediatricians a helpful starting point in choosing the facility that's best for their child," said Ben Harder, chief of health analysis and managing editor at U.S. News. "Recognizing that hospitals with inclusive and equitable cultures perform better, this year we added a new measure assessing hospitals' efforts to improve the equity of care provided and to promote diversity and inclusion among clinicians and staff."



Reflections of a Staff Nurse at Shriners Children's St. Louis

ny surgery comes with its own anxieties and concerns, but there is a certain elevated level of tension and worry when a child is having surgery. Many children are scared and intimidated by the whole experience.

No doubt about it, the patient's family is nervous and wants nothing more than for their child to get the best care and outcomes possible. Colleen Hogland doesn't take that lightly.

"We have stayed true to the mission by providing the highest quality care to our kids in a compassionate, family-centered environment," Colleen said about Shriners Children's St. Louis, the hospital to which she has dedicated the last four decades of her career. "We also continue research to improve our patients' quality of life."

Colleen prides herself on working for a healthcare system that emphasizes quality care in every way, and takes personal responsibility for providing the most amazing care anywhere for children and families facing surgeries

Colleen spent nearly 30 years as a staff nurse in one of the Shriners Children's St. Louis inpatient-nursing units. Since 2009, though, she has been an integral part of the pre-op and recovery team. She values the fact that Shriners Children's mission never wavers. While the mission remains the same, things have changed a lot over Colleen's long career in nursing.

"Our kids' length of stay is so much shorter now," Colleen said. "Visiting hours have changed a lot too. When I first came, even parents had to follow set visiting hours and were not allowed to stay overnight. All of the charting was on paper until 2004, when SHCIS (Shriners Hospitals for Children Internet System) came into our lives. I started in the day when we used 'one-inch by one-inch' medication cards to pass our meds. Now of course, we use the Medication Administration Wizard with barcoding."


While technology has advanced the practice and presented its own challenges over the years, Colleen's favorite part of the job never changes. "The kids are what make working here so special and wonderful," she said. "I love working at Shriners because of the beautiful, loving, happy, strong children we get to help get better every day."

Interactions with patients have provided a lot of special memories for Colleen over the years, but one encounter stands out. "We had a party at the old hospital before it closed in 2015, and so many of our previous long-term patients came back to see us," she recalled. "It was like a big reunion of patients, doctors and staff. The first patient I ever took care of in 1982 attended the party. I hadn't seen Dawn or her mom in more than 25 years."

For Colleen, it felt like mission accomplished.

"It was just so special to see them again," she said. "They were still so grateful for the care received at Shriners and how it changed her life."




