

Mission Committee

Thank You letters were received from CWS and UCC Global Ministries for the sponsorship of the CWS Hygiene Kits Assembly Party (144 Kits) and \$288 for the shipping fee, donated by Primetimers.

The Mission Committee is the recipient of a First Foundation Grant on November 9 for \$1500, equally divided for RHM Food Pantry, RHM Shelter Meals, CISRC School Supplies, CWS Kits and the Blessing Pantry items (\$300 each).

We will continue to stock the Blessing Pantry as long as we have the financial resources, donations and own the property at 207 West Horah Street. Larry Bolick stocked the Pantry in October, Rebecca Wrights in November and Linda Hauze in December for a total of \$160 reimbursement each month.

The Mission Committee is sponsoring 30 Star Tree Gifts for One Church One Child in December. Gift bags need to be returned to the church by Monday, December 1 to be delivered on December 2. Thanks to all who donated \$30 per Star Gift Cards or Gift Bags.

The Mission Committee will sponsor Study Time Care Packs for Catawba Students who have been helping and attending services in the chapel during the Pilot Program. The cost is \$15 per pack/per student. If interested in donating a Study Time Pack (\$15 each), please contact Larry Bolick, 828-612-8146 by November 30 and reimburse him directly. The Study Packs will be delivered on Monday, December 1 to student's residence or campus mailbox.

The Mission Committee will also sponsor a RHM Shelter Meal on Tuesday, December 23 from 5:30 – 8 pm. Dr. Ken Clapp will coordinate food purchases and supervise volunteers to prepare and serve the meals. Please let Larry Bolick (828-612-8146) know if you can volunteer or prepare a dessert for the meal.

BLOWING ROCK CONFERENCE CENTER 75TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION

Blowing Rock Conference Center celebrated 75th Anniversary of operation, beginning in 1950 after the Hughes Estate was purchased in 1945 by the Southern Synod of the E & R Church. Those attending from First Church members and friends were Edith and Larry Bolick, Ken Clapp, Joshua Jarrett, Glenda, Caleb and Charles Shrewsbury. A 75th Anniversary Quilt was presented with significant dates like the term of Edith and Homer Bonds as Seasonal Managers of Blowing Rock Assembly Grounds from 1950-67, and Ken Clapp as fulltime Executive Director of BRAG 1979-89. Larry Bolick served on the Board of Directors from 2015-2020 and chair the Board from 2018-20. Today, Ted Wilson served as the Executive Director from 2017 to present. He was on staff 10 years prior to his being named Ex. Dir. and has a wealth of experience with BRCC. The Century Club has been renamed "Rooted Together" Club for donors and contributors of the mission and ministry of BRCC. The four upcoming annually sponsored events of BRCC are Winter Youth Retreat, January 16-19, 2026, Retired Servants Retreat, May 3-6, Special Days Camp, June 23-26, and Bluebird Family Fiddle Camp, June 28-July 5. All donations to BRCC may be mailed to P. O. Box 2350, Blowing Rock, NC 28605. For the past several years, BRCC has been recipient of First Foundation Grants since residents of Rowan Country attend the Special Days Camp each year.

Take a Blessing, Leave a Blessing, Be a Blessing

A Blessing Pantry has been placed on our church property as an outreach to the neighboring community. It is located near the driveway into the parking lot on Church Street, just north of Monroe Street.

Members of the Mission Committee continue to monitor the box and add items at least once a week, but demand is great and it is usually emptied in a couple of days.

Popular items include:

Canned meats (chicken, tuna, ham, Spam) Healthy soups

Beef stew

Chef Boyardee canned meals Pop Tarts are appreciated

Canned fruits and vegetables

Peanut butter

Dehydrated foods like noodles, cereals, and dry beans Personal care products, including baby wipes

Inexpensive can openers for cans without pop-tops

Excluded items include those in glass packaging and fresh items that are perishable in the weather conditions.
