Grace and peace to you!



The Primetimers met on Thursday, September 11 with a Complimentary Meal, honoring Joyce Trexler upon her Birthday by friend and caterer Debbie Suggs. Rev. Anne Tambling led a devotional message on "Pilgrimage" as we are going on a journey through transition. An excellent program was presented on the 2025 Community Health Needs Assessment. Action was taken to give \$288 to pay for Church World Service shipping cost for 144 CWS Hygiene Kits. Thank you notes were read from Sarah Schiemann regarding Memorial Gifts in memory of her parents Romas and Sarah Shuping, and also a "Thank you" from Nazareth Child and Family Connection for a gift of \$100 for summer activities for students.

The Primetimers will meet on Wednesday, October 8 at 11:30 am at the home of Dr. Ken Clapp, 231 Confederate Ave., Salisbury in the Barn behind his home. Drive to the right of the house through the gate to the back of the property and park. He will be serving dishes from recipes for Catawba College Student Retreats printed in his recent cookbook, "Food For Body and Soul." He will also share a program on his new book that includes prayers he wrote for public Catawba College events during the 33 years he served as College Chaplain. This year 2025 is the 100th anniversary of Catawba College opening in Salisbury. Founded in 1851, Old Catawba College was located on South College Avenue, Newton, NC, closed in 1923 and reopened in Salisbury in 1925 at its present location. Also to celebrate the Catawba/Salisbury connection, the J. P. Clapp President's Home at Catawba College will be on the 50th Anniversary Historic Tour of Homes on October 11-12.

Mission Committee

The Mission Committee continues to supply The Blessing Pantry. Linda Hauze has been stocking the Pantry during September and Larry Bolick will do so in October. The WOW Bible Study participants have been bringing food items for the Blessing Pantry on Wednesday evenings. Thanks to all who have contributed to this outreach ministry.

Linda Hauze shared her recent experience of placing items in The Pantry, when an elderly man walking by greeted her, "So you are the one who puts food in the box." She replied, "Yes, along with our church." He continued, "This is on my daily walk, and I will take something for myself and an elderly friend of mine. Thank you for what you do! My name is John." "My name is Linda," as they exchanged names and goodwill for each other.

The Mission Committee is coordinating Church World Service Assembly Party on Thursday, October 9 from 6-8 pm in the Fellowship Hall with church members and Catawba College Students as our guests. Church members are invited to bring desserts to share at the close of the Party with our Catawba guests. A special "Thank you" for the financial support of First Foundation Grant, Circles 6 and 7, UCC Global Ministries Grant, and Primetimers to make possible the purchase of 6 cases of CWS Hygiene Kits to be assembled in 144 Kits and returned to the Distribution Center.

The Little Red Wagon will resume "Food for Thought" Backpack Program through Rowan Helping Ministries from September—December. In August 47 pounds were delivered to RHM Food Pantry and in July \$300 given to RHM Food Pantry. Thank you for your continued food donations.

Bless These Stitches

Those in the Bless These Stitches group have been working not just at our meetings but at home as well. There are lots of knitted and crocheted items on the shelf outside the office that are ready to go to their new homes. A Blessing Pantry has been placed on our church property as an outreach to the neighboring community. It is located near the driveway into the parking lot on Church Street, just north of Monroe Street.

Members of the Mission Committee continue to monitor the box and add items at least once a week, but demand is great and it is usually emptied in a couple of days.

Popular items include:

Canned meats (chicken, tuna, ham, Spam)

Healthy soups

Beef stew

Chef Boyardee canned meals

Pop Tarts are appreciated

Canned fruits and vegetables

Peanut butter

Dehydrated foods like noodles, cereals, and dry beans

Personal care products, including baby wipes

Inexpensive can openers for cans without pop-tops

Excluded items include those in glass packaging and fresh items that are perishable in the weather conditions.

Bring your contributions to the church and place them in the box provided in the Narthex. This bin will distinguish items intended for the Blessing Box from donations for the Little Red Wagon and Rowan Helping Ministries.
