# **FIVE ALIVE:** HELPING FAMILIES IN OUR COMMUNITY!

A client came to Rowan Helping Ministries seeking assistance to keep his water from being disconnected. He is 74 years old and is on a fixed income. This past winter, his HVAC system went out and he had to pay almost \$600.00 to have it repaired. Several months later he had problems with the HVAC system again that required an electrician. These repairs cost \$180.00. He also had unexpected car repairs a few weeks later. These unexpected expenses caused him to get behind on his water bill. A voucher was written by RHM to the Salisbury water department to keep his water from being disconnected.

The Five-Alive Fund is a non-budgeted mission of our church, and its purpose is to aid citizens of the Salisbury-Rowan area and our Church Family.
