*Bookbags/Backpacks *Dry Erase Markers *Composition Notebooks *Sanitizer


*Pencils *Kleenex *Crayons *Markers

CALLED CONGREGATIONAL MEETING SUNDAY, AUGUST 7 AFTER WORSHIP

There will be a congregational meeting on **August 7** after Worship to discuss and vote on air conditioning for the Church. The Property Committee received quotes for the project and made recommendations to Church Council on July 17. The proposal for discussion and vote is as follows:

Resources for HVAC systems

Property Committee is recommending accepting quote from Aire Serve for \$36,770 for 7 units, including them performing electrical work.

Church will need 50% down payment, remainder when complete Finance Committee is recommending allocating money from:

300.250 Bldg/Ground Maint Designated Funds - \$10,500 300.220 Living Memorial Designated Funds - \$8,270

300.002 Gen Fund MM - \$9,000

300.004 1st UCC Investments - Fdn Carolinas Balance - \$9,000

Donations accepted, but not planning a fund drive
