Dear Friends,

I'm excited! It's Advent! Actually, to be honest, I'm overwhelmed like all of you are because it's Advent! I am excited though. I'm excited about the sermon series we're going to be doing through Advent. It's a series based on a hymn. It's a hymn that is based on Psalm 98 which invites us to sing a new song, to make a joyful noise, and to rejoice and give thanks. The composer is Isaac Watts who was a Congregationalist hymnwriter, theologian, and minister who during his lifetime wrote over 750 hymns.

This year one of those hymns, Joy to the World, turns 300 years old. For many people this has become a beloved hymn. And while it was not originally written as a Christmas carol but it is often heard this time of the year. This hymn is a powerful cosmic performance of all creation being renewed and freed.

In preparation for this series I have been reading <u>The Book of Joy</u> which is a story where Archbishop Desmond Tutu and the Dalai Lama converse about joy. They had gathered together for this conversation in India where the Dalai Lama lives in exile.

As we approach the concept of joy, which is not another word for "happiness", I think we will discover that joy can be found even in the midst of suffering, in the work of justice, and in the presence of compassion. A lot of what we call joy is all about how we look at the world, how we interpret the world, and how we experience the world. Both Archbishop Tutu and the Dalai Lama have both experienced intense pain, suffering and conflict in their lives and yet they take delight in life. Their book reminds me that you can be filled with joy without necessarily being happy. They would tell you that because of their hardships they are two of the most joyful people in the world.

Yet they are aware that are many obstacles to joy from fear and stress, anger to grief, illness, and death...

Each week of Advent we will be exploring joy. Hopeful joy, loving joy, unabashed joy, peaceful joy, and of course, incarnate joy.

I hope you join us on this journey that leads us to Bethlehem once again. Hope to see you all in church!

Mission Committee Reaches Out

The Mission Committee served a meal at Rowan Helping Ministries Night Shelter on Saturday, November 30 thanks to the help of volunteers and donations for food. The committee continues to promote the Little Red Wagon for Christmas and Holiday meal items that can be used for Rowan Helping Ministries Food Closet. Items that are appreciated are canned meals, vegetables, fruits, beans and rice. We have 17 stars with a name and possibly a child's wish/suggestion for One Church Once Child's Christmas Stars that will be received in unwrapped gift bags and returned by Monday, December 9. The stars are available at the church office to pick up if you would like to sponsor a child for Christmas Stars for the Season.

The Annual Christmas Fund Offering will be received on Sunday, December 22. This Annual Offering is given to low income retired UCC ministers and their spouses to give an annual Christmas "Thank You" gift for their many years of ministry in the UCC. It also helps to supplement UCC pension annuitants with low monthly payments, supplement the UCC supplementary health insurance payments, and provides emergency grants for annuitants and their spouses. There are over 10,000 retired UCC annuitant members and their spouses who have served along side them in UCC settlings like the local church, church related institutions, and specialized ministries. The majority of them live a comfortable retirement due to the UCC pension fund annuities but some need assistance and receive it through The Christmas Fund.

The Annual Christmas Fund for the Veterans of the Cross and the Emergency Fund Offering will be received on Sunday, December 22. The theme this year is "A Light Shines in the Darkness." A light shines in the darkness for UCC pension annuitants for retired clergy and/or their spouses who need a little extra and to express appreciation for their years of service by a "Thank you" gift at Christmas time. A light shines in the darkness for annuitants whose monthly payments are low due to serving small churches or part-time calls to supplement their monthly income. A light shines in the darkness for annuitant members who need assistance to supplement their monthly health care insurance payments for supplementary insurance to Medicare. A light shines in the darkness for annuitants who have an emergency need to pay for unforeseen expenses like home repairs, medical expenses or living expenses. The UCC pension fund provides a program for annuitant members who receive an annual visit, phone calls, and cards from their assigned UCC annuitant visitors. Over 6,000 UCC retired ministers and their spouses are visited annually on behalf of the Pension Board. Rev. Larry Bolick, a member of First UCC, serves as an annuitant visitor for over 50 retired annuitant members and their spouses who live between Concord and High Point, NC. Please be generous in your annual gift to The Christmas Fund on December 22.
