#### CAROL'S CORNER





Dear Friends,

Isaiah the prophet said in chapter 9:2

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness on them light has shined.

Our current world feels to me as if it has wandered back into the darkness. We are a people that prefer darkness to light. We prefer to turn from the light, we fear it, we fear where it might lead us, we fear what it might demand of us, and so we hide behind our prejudices, our own beliefs and we gather with our own tribes. We forget that we are connected, each one to the other, through the love of our Savior, the light, the true light that came down on Christmas.

Here's the part of the story we like. The little baby, in a manger. The shepherds and the sheep in the fields, the wise men from the East and that tiny little one, no crying he makes.

But the reality is that at Bethlehem, God tears open the heavens and comes down, entering the madness, craziness, messiness of life, of incarnation and flesh. This child scrambles the way things have always been. Challenges the kings and principalities, the darkness that feeds on fear. He turns things inside out and upside down.

He welcomes those rejected elsewhere. He forgives the unforgiveable. He encourages the lost and comforts the grieving. But the powers and principalities prefer to hold onto their status, their power, their prestige. They liked how things had been going. They preferred their positions of power, the adulation they received.

So, they killed him. They didn't want to lose what they had.

But the good news is this, the story does not end there. It continues to be told, and his words continue to be spoken and people continue in the attempt to live them out. It is not easy. It has never been easy.

To love one another but if we love God, if we open our ears at all to the Word we have no other option but begin to let go of the fear, to reach for the light and to trust that when we take those steps into the light we do not, will not walk alone. We will not falter, nor will we fall. And if for some reason we do falter and fall, God will pick us up, dust us off, and encourage us to try again.

Epiphany is the season of light. The work of Christmas begins in the light and challenges us to continue to grow in our own faith as the community of people, the family of God, in all our differences and in all our similarities. We are called to be One in the Spirit.

Hope this New Year brings joy to your life and your heart.



#### Five Alive: A Thank-Note From Rowan Helping Ministries



In the first three months of our fiscal year, our kind and caring donors, like you, made the things possible through your gifts:

-936 individuals received \$82,939 in financial assistance for rent, utilities, medicine and other critical needs;
-284 different guests were provided a safe place to spend

the night in our shelter; -20,929 meals were served to the hungry in Jeannie's Kitchen; (*Our Mission Committee is helping with this program!*)

-1,722 households visited our Food Pantry, where 198,493 pounds of groceries were distributed;

-936 individuals received new or gently-used clothing from our Clothing Center;

-6,146 *Food for Thought* food bags were given to Rowan County children each week, so they would have enough to eat on weekends.

Though your donation, you have allowed your heart to lead you in helping your neighbors in need. You are helping us feed the hungry, house the homeless and give hope to those working to build better lives.
