Five Alive: A Thank-You Note from Rowan Helping Ministries

The following is a copy of a letter with eye opening numbers from Rowan Helping Ministries thanking us for our continued support through our Five Alive Fund and the Little Red Wagon programs.

Because of your generous heart, basic needs will be provided, hope will be renewed and lives win be changed!

In the first nine months of our fiscal year, our kind and caring donors, like donors (including our own Five-Alive and Little Red Wagon programs) and volunteers made these things possible:

- 2,757 individuals received \$277,493 in financial assistance for rent, utilities, medicine and other critical needs for survival;

- 722 different guests were provided a safe place to spend the night in our shelter;
-62,594 meals were served to the hungry in Jeannie's Kitchen (Our Mission Committee)

-2,924 household visited our Food Pantry, where 540,778 pounds of groceries were distributed;

-4,292 individuals received new or gently-used clothing from our Clothing Center; -21,686 Food for Thought food bags were given to Rowan County children each week, so they would have enough to eat on weekends.

Through you donations, you have allowed your heart to lead you in helping your neighbors in need. You are helping us feed the hungry, house the homeless and give hope to those working to build better lives.


