https://www.generalsynod.org/proposed-resolutions/ At this link you can find that various resolutions that will be discussed and acted upon by the UCC General Synod meeting this month. There will also be a vote on some necessary Constitution and by-law changes.

One that the Southern Conference has sent to General Synod is called, "A Resolution to Advocate and Act to Change the Cash Bail Bond System to Eliminate Racial and Social Injustices inherent in the present system.

These resolutions go to various committees made up of delegates from our churches. They look at, read, talk about maybe suggest and sometimes make changes to these resolutions. If everything goes smoothly then these are moved to the floor, where people can comment, debate, agree, disagree with them. Even on the floor changes might be made.

But Synod is not just about business, it's about worship too. Gathering together all the delegates and visitors in praise and worship we get to see the broad expression of the faith of our UCC churches.

But wait, there's more! There are speakers. One of them this year is Valerie Kaur, a social activist and film maker. She leads campaigns for civil and human rights. Her first film came out of a response to the killing of a Sikh Family friend murdered shortly after 9/11. It was a crime of hate. The other Key-note speaker is Rev. Adam Russell Taylor who is President of Sojourners. There will be 50 workshops available both pre-recorded and live. There are many opportunities to learn and grow and be challenged in faith.

Some of the content, including worship will be free. To register as a visitor is \$100. They are trying to get many of our members interested and involved and this is indeed a great opportunity to see the wider church in action.
