CAROL'S CORNER

Dear Friends,

It was the best of times. It was the worst of times. Depending on who you listen to, on who you ask. It was the worst of times because you had to think through and plan any travels. You couldn't go to all the places you wanted, only essentials. For the young it truly was the worst of times because their parents didn't know how to handle being home with them all the time- and the abuse got worse with no outsider to see the bruises and scars. For the mentally ill and those who were alone and for those whose only contact was book club or church or card clubs, it was the worst of times.

For others though, it was indeed the best of times. Families got to spend more time together without having to run from sport to sport or class to class. People learned to bake and craft, play an instrument, read books, clean out rooms, and catch up on chores.

For others work remained essential. They stocked shelves, cleaned floors and bathrooms at stores and hospitals, they stood behind barriers bagging groceries and taking money, they drove semi's, donned PPE's and masks, prayed by the side of those dying from the disease, because their loved ones couldn't be there.

The earth got a rest and began to breathe. Skies cleared of pollution, but more plastic was generated as plastic bags became the only way to carry groceries home. Planes grounded. Cars driven less. No one in the oceans or at the parks. Animals spread further in their territory walking and ambling, less afraid amid the trees.

It would be nice to say that it was a time when all people came together but they didn't. Some thought this disease no big deal, maybe a little worse than the flu. The numbers of possible dead, well they seemed acceptable in order to continue to live the way they had been living. But others, well they came together, they began to see that the people that they had been taking for granted, the ones paid minimum wage as they rang up your groceries and cooked your food and served you were the ones needed in the middle of a Pandemic. Along with doctors, nurses, cleaning staff, teachers, we learned the value of each along the way.

Some wore masks to protect others for fear that they themselves could be carriers but others refused because they believed that they had nothing to fear and it was some political tom foolery that was all about politics and not science which they didn't believe anyway-the science that is.

After all, not everyone got sick, and of those who got sick just a few-a tiny portion- ended up in the hospital. Some died, but death happens. When you are out of work and not getting paid and you can't pay the rent, or utilities or put food on the table, the risk seems worth it. For others the walls begin to cave in, and you can't breathe, and the time goes so slow, every minute an hour, every hour a day, every day an eternity.

But if you are part of those impacted, whose loved one goes to the hospital and you can't be there and all you can do is wait, for phone calls, alternating between fervent prayers...arguing with God, yelling at God, beseeching God...

For the ones who gathered at gravesides with under 10 allowed including the preacher...to the ones grieving alone because they can't be with others...and the weeping and the wailing...and the wanting to die too...

When some forgot the great commandment, the one Jesus gave us on the night of betrayal and desertion...and yet that same night there was betrayal and there was denial...have we learned nothing since then...

And yet...on Easter morning when they went to the tomb...it was empty, he was risen. "O death where is your victory, O death where is your sting?'. Love, O the amazing gracious love of our God, that love reigns, it continues to pour out for all of us. And we knew that whether it was the best of times or the worst that we were not alone...for we were reminded that in the end...love wins...

Continue to stay safe, wear a mask, socially distance, and wash your hands.

The following is another success story made possible by contributions from individuals, organizations and **your own Five Alive Fund** to Rowan Helping Ministries.

A client came to Rowan Helping Ministries seeking assistance with his first month's rent. The client is a 60 year old veteran on a fixed income. He has been living in Greensboro with some other veterans. He has PTSD and is being treated at the Salisbury VA Hospital. The travel between Greensboro and Salisbury has caused problems with his PTSD. He has found an apartment in Salisbury and needed help with his first month's rent. He paid a portion of the rent and RHM issued a voucher that would pay the remaining balance. He will be sustainable going forward. He was excited to know he would have his own place and be near his needed treatment.
