She worked until June 24, 2021, when her doctor took her out of work due to pregnancy related complications. The client is behind on her water bill. Once she returns to work, she will be sustainable. RHM requested proof of SSI for her 2 sons, medical documentation of the reason she is out of work, child support received, and documentation of the funds her sons receive from their father. The client provided the information requested. Rowan Helping Ministries granted her a voucher to the City of Salisbury for the balance of her water bill to stop disconnection.

Your contributions to our Five Alive Fund is always appreciated, and 100% is used to help citizens of Salisbury/Rowan area or our Church family with unforeseen short term emergencies.
