## CAROL'S CORNER

Paul, called to be an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and our brother Sosthenes,

<sup>2</sup>To the church of God that is in Corinth, to those who are sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints, together with all those who in every place call on the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, both their Lord<sup>[a]</sup> and ours:

<sup>3</sup>Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

<sup>4</sup>I give thanks to my<sup>[b]</sup> God always for you because of the grace of God that has been given you in Christ Jesus,.

<sup>10</sup>Now I appeal to you, brothers and sisters,<sup>[d]</sup> by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you be in agreement and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same purpose. <sup>11</sup>For it has been reported to me by Chloe's people that there are quarrels among you, my brothers and sisters.<sup>[e]</sup> <sup>12</sup>What I mean is that each of you says, "I belong to Paul," or "I belong to Apollos," or "I belong to Cephas," or "I belong to Christ." <sup>13</sup>Has Christ been divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul?

1 Corinthians 1:1-4a; 10-13

Jesus: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself."

Friends,

What is our purpose? Paul is speaking to people who are arguing over some very basic and simple, at least according to Paul differences. About who to listen to, who to follow. He tells them quite plainly that there is but one God, one Jesus. Sometimes we forget that, in the middle of all that is happening in our world. We forget whose we are. In forgetting whose we are, we also forget our purpose.

It's really quite simple Jesus says when asked the most important commandment, the most important thing that we can do. Love God. Love each other.

In order to love others, we have to love ourselves also. Yet I come back to this question. "what is our purpose as the Church-with a capital C?"

On August 29<sup>th</sup> we renewed our covenant to be church. What does that mean? It means we made promises to and with one another. It means that, with God's help, we will do our best to love one another, not just here in this building but beyond these walls in our community and world.

It means that we stand in solidarity, as Jesus did, with the poor, the lonely, the grieving, the lost, the marginalized. It means that we take time to analyze how the way of Christ is different from the way of our world. It means standing up and speaking out for the ones without voice. It means offering hope to the ones without hope. And it means sharing our time, our talent, and tithe to make our church and the world around us a better place. A place of equality, a place of caring, compassion, and healing. A place which acknowledges injustice and works for justice. Yet it is hard, as Paul says when we don't place our faith in Christ, and him crucified. That the cross is a message that seems foolish and the kin-dom that Jesus wants us to build seems so antithetical to the values of the world around us.

Yet we are called to Be the Church. You may have seen the sign. "Be the CHURCH. Protect the environment. Care for the poor. Forgive often, (that's a tough one!), Reject racism. Fight for the powerless. Share earthly and spiritual resources. Embrace diversity. Enjoy this life."

As we move through this month of September, I invite us all to be in prayer over what God is calling this church specifically to do. In what ways is God bringing us together? What gifts and graces are ours uniquely that can make a difference with each other, our community, and our world?"

The client was happy to know that he could continue to provide a home for his son.

***From the Mission Committee ...***

The Mission Committee met on Thursday, August 19 and made plans for the next weeks and into the fall months.

The Little Red Wagon food items will be delivered at the end of the month to give folks the opportunity to bring items throughout the month even though Little Red Wagon Sunday is the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of each month.

The school supplies for Community in Schools for Rowan County were dedicated on Sunday, August 29 and items will be delivered that week or shortly after Labor Day.

The next Drive By Community Food Drive for Rowan Helping Ministries will be Saturday, September 11 from 10—12 noon at the back entrance/parking lot.

The Annual Neighbors In Need Offering will be received on Sunday, October 3 for UCC local church grants for local ministries and for the Council for American Indian Ministries grants.

If we have volunteers available, the committee will sponsor a Saturday evening meal in November at Rowan Helping Ministries Night Shelter for overnight guests.

The Annual UCC Offering for Veterans of the Cross-Christmas Fund will be in December.

Star gifts will be sponsored for members to provide a gift for a child thru Rowan County Department of Social Services.

The next meeting time will be Thursday, September 9 at 7 pm in the Fellowship Hall.

***Covid Task Force News ...***

The Covid Task Force is aware that we are seeing an uptick of cases in Rowan County and in North Carolina. Mainly these are in unvaccinated individuals. We also know that at least some of these cases are the Delta Variant which has involved some breakthrough cases among those vaccinated. At this time the Task Force continues to urge caution to our members and while those vaccinated are not required to wear masks we do encourage those who aren't to wear one. Our own church groups have the opportunity at this time to choose to return to meeting in person. So far Bless These Stitches is the only group which has chosen to begin again but other groups might want to talk among themselves to see how they are feeling about in person meetings.

During the month of August we have reopened the nursery and Sunday School. We want to remind members that those who are 12 and under are not vaccinated yet. We urge caution around the vulnerable ones in our midst. Again, masks are not required are strongly encouraged. If you are around the children you might want to mask up either way or if not at least ensure that you keep your social distance. We do encourage all members to honor individual decisions and personal spaces during this time. Please, do be especially cautious around our children. Thank you.
