COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

August 11, 2021 – 7:00 PM

The City Council of Panorama Park, Iowa met in a regular session at 7:00 PM, Wednesday, August 11, 2021 in the City Hall.

CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Rice called the meeting to order at 7:01 PM. A quorum was reached.

AGENDA APPROVAL

Discussion and approval of the council meeting agenda for Wednesday, August 11, 2021. Mayor Rice asked if any item should be removed from the consent agenda or if there were any changes to the meeting agenda. Mayor Rice asked that the agenda be amended to include a presentation from the City Clerk about the upcoming municipal election and Resolution 2021-09 regarding snow removal. Hearing no additional comments, Mayor Rice called for a vote. *A motion was made by D. Smith and seconded by S. Perry. Roll Call: S. Rice - aye. The motion was approved.*

PRESENTATIONS

The City Clerk discussed the upcoming municipal election and distributed petition papers to any interested parties.

PUBLIC COMMENTS TO THE COUNCIL

Betty Leach asked about the legality of live trapping raccoons. Mayor Rice referred her to the Nuisance Wildlife Control Manual from the DNR that states that permits are needed to trap outside the hunting season which is November through January.

MAYOR'S REPORT

- Update on the sanitary sewer system repair project. Vendors are meeting on August 12 at Panorama Park City Hall in order to ask MSA questions. Chris Cooper and Mayor Rice will attend. Bids will be opened at 1:30 PM on August 19th at Riverdale City Hall.

- Per S. Rice, Oktoberfest will be on October 15th and feature a Chili cookoff, a Bluegrass band and activities for kids. David White will be honored for his many years of service to the community.

Perry voiced concerns about the costs, but added that the City of Bettendorf did a very good job last year. Mayor Rice called for a vote. *Roll Call: T. Huber - absent, S. Perry - aye, S. Rice - aye, D. Smith - aye, D. White - absent. Resolution 2021-09 was approved.*
