MEETING MINUTES

June 12, 2019 – 6:00 PM

The City Council of Panorama Park, Iowa met in regular session at 6:00 PM, Wednesday, June 12, 2019 in the City Hall.

Council Members Present: B. Elmore, J. Krause, M. Lauritzson, S. Rice, D. White

Presiding: Mayor Ronald Rice

Call to Order

Mayor Rice called the meeting to order at 6:03 PM. A quorum was reached.

Agenda Approval

Mayor Rice asked if there were any questions on the agenda and hearing none, asked for a motion to approve. *A motion was made by D. White, seconded by M. Lauritzson to approve the Agenda as presented. With no further discussion, Roll Call: B. Elmore - aye, J. Krause - aye, S. Rice - aye. Agenda was approved.*

Mayor's Report

- Focus on Safety. The sheriff removed the electronic speed sign because it was not working. Mayor Rice will follow up with the sheriff to reinstate an electronic sign as the first step in an effort to stop speeding on Park Ave.
- Health Nuisance Abatement Notice. Mayor Rice and Councilperson S. Rice attended an abatement workshop and reported on their findings. The city implemented a complaint form that is posted on the city website that residents may use to report infractions. The city also sent out a mass letter outlining the city ordinances concerning grass, brush piles, and junk vehicles. A Notice to Abate was sent by certified mail to residents at 916 Park Ave, 106 6th Street, and 5734 Park Ave. All three residents made efforts to abate, but not enough to satisfy the code. Mayor Rice will follow up after meeting with the Scott County Sheriff and the City Attorney before the city takes further action to abate the properties.
- Municipal Election Location. Roxanna Moritz, commissioner of elections, notified the city that due to a change in the state law, the future city elections will be held at Tanglewood Pavilion.

Committee Reports

Culture and Recreation. A Bluegrass Festival featuring the Quarter Moon Tin Snips will be held on Saturday, June 22 from 1-3. Big garbage pickup day will be on Monday, July 15. There was little interest in hosting a city-wide garage sale.

Unfinished Business

1. Third (3rd) reading, discussion, and approval of revised Sewer Ordinances 99.02. Following the third reading of Ordinance 99.02 Mayor Rice asked if there were any questions or corrections to the ordinance. Hearing no other comments, Mayor Rice called for a vote. *A motion was made by B. Elmore and seconded by J. Krause to approve Ordinance 99.02 as presented. With no further discussion, Roll Call: M. Lauritzson - aye, S. Rice - aye, D. White - aye. The motion was approved.*

New Business

1. Discussion and approval of Council meeting minutes from May 8, 2019. Mayor Rice asked if there were any questions or corrections to the minutes. Hearing no other comments, Mayor Rice called for a vote. *A motion was made by J. Krause and seconded by D. White to approve the May 8, 2019 meeting minutes as presented. With no further discussion, Roll Call: B. Elmore - aye, M. Lauritzson - aye, S. Rice - aye. The motion was approved.*
2. Discussion and approval of expenses. Council members reviewed expenses. Mayor Rice asked if there were any questions, and hearing none, called for a vote to approve expenses. *A motion was made by J. Krause and seconded by M.Lauritzson to approve the May expenses as presented. With no further discussion, Roll Call: B. Elmore - aye, S. Rice - aye, D. White - aye. The motion was approved*
3. Discussion and approval of monthly Financial Statements. Council members reviewed the financial statements. Mayor Rice asked if there were any questions, and hearing none, called for a vote to approve the financial statements as presented. *A motion was made by M. Lauritzson and seconded by B. Elmore to approve the Financial Statements as presented. With no further discussion, Roll Call: J. Krause - aye, S. Rice - aye, D. White - aye. The motion was approved.*
4. Discussion and approval of the street repair bid. Bettendorf will be repairing their section of North Street after the fiscal year begins. M. Lauritzson will follow up after July 1, 2019. The Tri-City Blacktop bid for North Street, Short Street, and Park Avenue was \$16,960, but that is without repairing the driveway apron at 719 Park Avenue. With the addition of the driveway apron the total cost for all repairs is not to exceed \$17,500. *A motion was made by M. Lauritzson and seconded by D. White to approve Mayor Rice to accept an amended bid not to exceed \$17,500. With no further discussion, Roll Call: B. Elmore - aye, J. Krause - aye, S. Rice - aye. The motion was approved.*
5. Discussion of a potential fence ordinance. Currently the city does not have a fence ordinance. Council members will forward suggestions to Mayor Rice and he will present them for review at the July 10 meeting.
6. Discussion of potential changes to the dilapidated building ordinance. Mayor Rice requested that Council Members submit changes that they would like made to the ordinance. Mayor Rice will present the suggested changes for review at the July 10 meeting.
