# Call to Order

Mayor Rice called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM. A quorum was reached.

# Mayor's Report

- Street repair update. Mayor Rice recommends that street repairs be delayed until Spring 2020. Given the need for sanitary sewer repairs, this will allow time for the patched section to settle.
- North Street update. According to Brent Morlok with the City of Bettendorf, they have awarded the contract to repair North Street to Corson Excavating. Completion is expected by October 17<sup>th</sup>.
- Sanitary Sewer System update. The video inspection has been completed and confirmed the pipe collapse near Second (2<sup>nd</sup>) Street and Park Avenue. Chris Cooper with MSA Professional Services estimates that the repair costs could be as much as \$15,000. MSA has provided written specifications for the repair and recommended several contractors that could perform the needed repairs. MSA is still reviewing the video for the remainder of the system and will provide their recommendations once they are finished.
- Health Nuisance Abatement Notice. 5734 Valley Drive continues to improve. It is now being mowed
  regularly and some of the junk piles have been cleaned up. There are still piles of junk that have not
  been disposed of. A Final Notice to Abate was sent to 106 6<sup>th</sup> Street regarding mowing and weeds. The
  weeds have since been cut and the property is now in compliance.

# Committee Reports

Culture and Recreation. S. Rice stated that the 4<sup>th</sup> Annual Chili Cook Off was a success with about sixty (60) people in attendance. Sally Haugun was this years winner for the best chili. S. Rice also informed the Council that Halloween will be celebrated from 5-7 PM on October 31<sup>st</sup>. Residents are encourage to congregate at City Hall to pass out candy to the neighborhood children.

## **Unfinished Business**

- 1. Discussion and approval of bid to excavate the ditch along North Street. Mayor Rice recommended delaying the ditch improvements until the North Street reconstruction and the sanitary sewer repairs were completed. With no further discussion, no *motion was made to accept any of the bids.*
- 2. Discussion of Health Abatement Plan for 5734 Valley Drive. Mayor Rice indicated that the Abatement Notices have yielded some results and that no further action is recommended at this time. Mayor Rice also expressed his desire to update all of the ordinances relating to dilapidated buildings and nuisance abatement.

CITY OF PANORAMA PARK RESOLUTION 2019-13 NOVEMBER 13, 2019

RESOLUTION OF PANORAMA PARK, IOWA ACCEPTING AND APPROVING A NEW INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT PROVIDING FOR OPERATIONS, MAINTENANCE AND IMPROVEMENTS FOR THE JOINT USE INTERCEPTOR SEWERS, REGIONAL WATER POLLUTION CONTROL PLANT, AND APPURTENANCES, EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2020.

WHEREAS, the Cities of Davenport, Bettendorf, Riverdale, and Panorama Park (collectively referred to as the "Municipalities") desire to work together for the purpose of delivering regional waste water treatment services; and

**WHEREAS,** the Municipalities entered into an intergovernmental agreement on January 5, 1974, and amended from time to time (such intergovernmental agreement and amendments, the "IGA") to jointly contract, construct, acquire, maintain, and use certain sanitary sewers and appurtenances thereto and a sewerage treatment facility; and

**WHEREAS,** the Municipalities desire to repeal the IGA and to create a new agreement for the mutual benefit of the Municipalities; and

**WHEREAS,** all Municipalities desire to jointly own, use, maintain, and improve certain interceptor sewers and appurtenances across their respective jurisdictions, a water pollution control plant, and a compost facility; and

**WHEREAS**, intergovernmental cooperation between units of local government to contract, further combine, or transfer lawful power or function in any manner not prohibited by law or ordinance is authorized by and pursuant to Chapter 28E, of the 2019 Code of Iowa; and

**WHEREAS,** all aspects of this Agreement are designed and intended to enhance the public health, safety, morals and welfare, as related to the Municipalities.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** in a spirit of comity, and pursuant to the appropriate constitutional and statutory provisions, that this resolution approving a new intergovernmental agreement providing for operations, maintenance and improvements for the joint use interceptor sewers, regional water pollution control plant, and appurtenances, effective July 1, 2020 is hereby approved by the City Council.
