MEETING MINUTES November 13, 2019 – 6:00 PM

The City Council of Panorama Park, Iowa met in regular session at 6:00 pm, Wednesday, November 13, 2019 in the City Hall.

Call to Order

Mayor Rice called the meeting to order at 6:04 PM. A quorum was reached.

Agenda Approval

Mayor Rice added discussion and approval for new Council Members to attend the Municipal Leadership Academy workshop as New Business item 10 to the Agenda. Mayor Rice asked if there were any additional questions regarding the agenda and hearing none, asked for a motion to approve. A motion was made by S. Rice, seconded by J. Krause, to approve the Agenda as presented. With no further discussion, Roll Call: B. Elmore – aye, D. White – aye. Agenda was approved.

Presentations

Advantage Tree Service presented their quotation for FY2019-2020 plowing season. Jerry Scheese from Advantage brought a new contract to meeting and stayed to answer questions. The bid was the same as last year's bid, but the city requested that salt be used for every snow event. The city also requested that Short St. be plowed wider, following the markers in a resident's lawn. J. Krause suggested that the city send out a notice to residents to warn against street parking during snow removal.

Mayor's Report

- Election Results. Per the Scott County Auditor's office, 27 votes were cast at the Tanglewood Pavilion polling place. Ronald
 Rice received 27 votes for Mayor. David Smith received 27 votes, Shawn Rice 26 votes, David White 26 votes, Steven Perry
 25 votes, and Tim Huber received 14 write-in votes for City Council.
- Sanitary Sewer/Road Repairs. The repairs took longer than expected due to waiting on parts, frigid weather, and an
 unexpected problem with erosion under the street. The sewer repairs are completed, but the road work cannot be
 completed until the frigid weather subsides, which should be next week.
- Sanitary Sewer System inspection update
- The Bettendorf Public Works Department has completed the video inspection of the sanitary sewer system. MSA is evaluating the video and they have been paid the first of three installments for their services.

- 1. Discussion and approval to accept the snow plowing bid of \$480 guaranteed, \$80 per hour, and \$30 per bag for salt from Advantage Tree Service. Mayor Rice asked if there were any questions or concerns and hearing none he called for a vote. A motion was made by D. White and seconded by B. Elmore to approve the Advantage Tree Service snow plowing quote as presented. With no further discussion, Roll Call: J. Krause aye, S. Rice aye. The motion was approved.
- 2. Discussion and approval of Resolution 2019-10 to accept the resignation of Susan Dazey as City Clerk. Mayor Rice shared Susan Dazey's resignation letter with the Council and called for a vote. A motion was made by S. Rice and seconded by J. Krause to approve Resolution 2019-10 as presented. With no further discussion, Roll Call: B. Elmore aye, D. White aye. The motion was approved.

- 3. Discussion and approval of Resolution 2019-11 to appoint Gary Gleason as City Clerk/Treasurer. Mayor Rice asked if there were any questions or concerns and hearing none he called for a vote. A motion was made by J. Krause and seconded by D. White to approve Resolution 2019-11 as presented. With no further discussion, Roll Call: B. Elmore aye, S. Rice aye. The motion was approved.
- 4. Discussion and approval of the Regular Meeting Minutes from October 9, 2019. Mayor Rice asked if there were any questions or corrections to the minutes. Hearing no other comments, Mayor Rice called for a vote. A motion was made by D. White and seconded by S. Rice to approve the October 9, 2019 meeting minutes as presented. With no further discussion, Roll Call: B. Elmore aye, J. Krause aye. The motion was approved.
- 5. Discussion and approval of Special Meeting Minutes from October 15, 2019. Mayor Rice asked if there were any questions or corrections to the minutes. Hearing no other comments, Mayor Rice called for a vote. *A motion was made by J. Krause and seconded by B. Elmore to approve the October 15, 2019 meeting minutes as presented. With no further discussion, Roll Call: S. Rice aye, D. White aye. The motion was approved.*
- 6. Discussion and approval of Expenses. Council members reviewed expenses. Mayor Rice asked if there were any questions. Hearing no other comments, Mayor Rice called for a vote to approve expenses. A motion was made by S. Rice and seconded by D. White to approve the expenses as presented. With no further discussion, Roll Call: B. Elmore aye, J. Krause aye. The motion was approved.
- 7. Discussion and approval of monthly Financial Statements. Council members reviewed the Financial Statements. Mayor Rice asked if there were any questions or corrections and hearing none, Mayor Rice called for a vote. A motion was made by J. Krause and seconded by B. Elmore to approve the Financial Statements as presented. With no further discussion, Roll Call: S. Rice aye, D. White aye, the motion was approved.
- 8. Discussion and approval of Resolution 2019-12 to accept the Annual Financial Report, AFR for the Fiscal Year ended June 30, 2019. Council members reviewed the AFR. Mayor Rice asked if there were any questions or corrections and hearing none, Mayor Rice called for a vote. A motion was made by S. Rice and seconded by J. Krause to approve the Financial Statements as presented. With no further discussion, Roll Call: B. Elmore aye, D. White aye, the motion was approved.
- 9. Discussion and approval of Resolution 2019-13 to accept a new intergovernmental agreement providing for operations, maintenance and improvements for the joint use interceptor sewers, regional water pollution control plant, and appurtenances. Mayor Rice reviewed the concerns and recommendations of City Attorney Jeff McDaniel. D. White expressed his concerns about liability exposure from customers located in the other municipalities. Mayor Rice stated that he would follow up with the City Attorney and the city's insurance provider. Mayor Rice then called for a vote. A motion was made by S. Rice and seconded by J. Krause to approve the Financial Statements as presented. With no further discussion, Roll Call: B. Elmore aye, D. White aye, the motion was approved.
- 10. Discussion and approval for new Council Members to attend the Municipal Leadership Academy workshop. Mayor Rice reviewed the materials provided by the lowa League of Cities and recommended that the newly elected Council Members attend at a cost not to exceed \$200 each. With no additional questions or comments from the Council, Mayor Rice called for a vote. A motion was made by J. Krause and seconded by B. Elmore to approve the new Council Members to attend the workshop. With no further discussion, Roll Call: S. Rice aye, D. White aye. The motion was approved.
