#### Mayor:

I had an opportunity to meet with my Operations staff to discuss the potential to provide snow and ice removal and sanitary sewer cleaning for the City of Panorama Park. We propose to provide winter maintenance operations at the same level of service as the City of Bettendorf at a rate of \$185.00 per hour with a minimum of an hour and a half per event. This would also include spreading salt as necessary to ensure the roads are safe. We also proposed to provide sanitary sewer cleaning services at a rate of \$1.25 per liner foot and \$1.25 per lineal foot to televise the sewers. Our GIS staff estimated a length of 3,730 lineal feet of sewer within Panorama Park city limits for your reference. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me.



#### Call to Order

## COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES April 11, 2020 – 9:15 a.m.

The City Council of Panorama Park, Iowa met in regular session at 9:15 a.m., Saturday, April 11, 2020 via Zoom Electronic Meeting.

In Attendance: T. Huber, S. Perry, S. Rice, D. Smith

Council Members Absent: D. White

Also Present: Mayor Ronald Rice, Treasurer Gary Gleason, Mandi Lauritzson

**Presiding:** Mayor Ronald Rice

#### Call to Order

Mayor Rice called the meeting to order at 9:15 a.m. A quorum was reached.

#### **Agenda Approval**

Discussion and approval of Council Meeting Agenda for Saturday, April 11, 2020. Mayor Rice asked if there were any questions or changes regarding the agenda. Mayor Rice called for a motion to approve the agenda. A motion was made by S. Rice, seconded by D. Smith. With no further discussion Roll Call: T. Huber - aye, S. Perry - aye. The agenda was approved.

#### **Presentations**

Chris Cooper from MSA Professional Services presented the Sanitary Sewer Report and responded to questions. Regarding manholes, Steve Perry asked about the urgency of repairs. Mr. Cooper stated that infiltration of groundwater into the system is the reason for concern and that the 28E agreement requires the city to show good faith effort in repairs. Mr. Cooper also explained that during the lining process, sections of the sanitary sewer would be rerouted. At least two areas have a 95% blockage due to root infiltration. It is possible to get rid of roots, but they will come back unless the system is lined. All openings in the main for lateral lines will be connected, but maintenance of the lateral lines from the main to the home is the responsibility of homeowners.

#### **Public Comments to the Council**

Mandi Lauritzson inquired about the timing and cost for the recommended sanitary sewer repairs. Mayor Rice responded that the estimated cost would be about \$130,000.00; however, the costs could be reduced if repair work is coordinated with Riverdale or Bettendorf. A joint lining project for the sanitary sewer system would not likely happen until 2021, but the other recommended repairs could happen as soon as this year. Regarding the liability for sewage backups, the city is insured should a resident incur damage due to a backup. Mayor Rice will consult with the City Attorney regarding the limit of liability. The city will also investigate the cost to have the serious root blockages removed as a separate project.

#### Mayor's Report

Mayor Rice provided information on the condition of streets and the planned repairs for this year. Mayor Rice is negotiating with Bettendorf to sealcoat their section of North Street. This will likely be a joint project in which Panorama Park will be reimbursed by Bettendorf for their portion of the work. Repairs are also needed for Short Street and Park Ave between 2nd and 3rd Streets. All of the road work should be completed by Labor Day.

#### Committee Reports

No events due to the global Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic.

#### **Unfinished Business**

- 1. Discussion and approval to survey the boundaries for North Street. Surveying of North Street will be conducted next week and the City of Bettendorf has agreed to pay half of the survey costs. This expense was approved in the March 14, 2020 Council Meeting.
- 2. Discussion of solutions to prevent mail theft. Mayor Rice consulted with the Bettendorf Postmaster about placing a drop box at City Hall. The postal service denied the request due to the small number of residents that would be served. The postmaster suggested converting to community mailboxes, but the total cost could exceed \$8000.00. The previous mail was reported to the Scott County Sheriff, but it has not been resolved.

#### **New Business**

1. Discussion of Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic impact. Mayor Rice has been participating in ongoing Scott County Emergency Management Agency meetings and press conferences. Due to the Governor's executive order mandating social distancing, Mayor Rice stated that he had purchased a monthly subscription for Zoom meetings. This was the best option to

insure public access to the monthly Council Meetings. Republic Services has informed the city of new requirements for recycling and garbage collection due to the pandemic. This information has been posted in the message centers and on the website. Mayor Rice also expects that revenue from the Local Option Sales Tax and from state highway funds to drop significantly. As part of the city's emergency plan, S. Perry suggested that the city collect email addresses and phone numbers from residents to improve communications in an emergency. Mayor Rice will include a request for emergency contact information in a newsletter to all residents.

- 2. Discussion of sanitary sewer system presentation and report. Steve Perry suggested repairing areas flagged as condition 4 (red) and 3 (orange). Mayor Rice states that he is negotiating with the City of Bettendorf to include Panorama Park in their sanitary sewer lining project planned for 2021. Due to economies of scale, there could be considerable cost savings by consolidating the two cities' lining projects.
- 3. Discussion of storm water drainage issues. Mayor Rice stated that the recent storm has caused erosion to portions of the roadway and the repairs will need to be included into the upcoming road repair project. This should include excavating sediment from the storm water drainage ditches. Steve Perry brought up the issue of sump pumps discharging into the sanitary sewer system. Our Joint Contract Sewerage 28E Agreement prohibits this practice. Mayor Rice will include a statement about this issue in the newsletter.
- 4. Discussion and approval of Resolution 2020-09 to accept the proposed FY2020 Budget Amendment. Mayor Rice asked if there were any questions or corrections to the proposed budget amendment. Hearing no comments, Mayor Rice called for a vote. A motion was made by T. Huber and seconded by D. Smith. With no further discussion, Roll Call: S. Perry aye, S. Rice aye. The motion was approved.
- 5. Discussion and approval of Resolution 2020-10 to reinvest CDs that mature in April 2020. Mayor Rice explained that the balances would go in the savings account to pay expenses or be reinvested at a future date. Mayor Rice asked if there were any questions or corrections to the resolution. Hearing no comments, Mayor Rice called for a vote. A motion was made by S. Perry and seconded by D. Smith. With no further discussion, Roll Call: T. Huber aye, S. Rice aye. The motion was approved.
- 6. Discussion and approval of minutes from the March 14, 2020 FY2021 Budget Hearing. Mayor Rice asked if there were any questions or corrections to the minutes. Hearing no comments, Mayor Rice called for a vote. A motion was made by S. Rice and seconded by D. Smith. With no further discussion, Roll Call: T. Huber aye, S. Perry aye. The motion was approved.
- 7. Discussion and approval of minutes from the March 14, 2020 Council Meeting. Mayor Rice asked if there were any questions or corrections to the minutes. Hearing no comments, Mayor Rice called for a vote. A motion was made by T. Huber and seconded by D. Smith. With no further discussion, Roll Call: S. Perry aye, S. Rice aye. The motion was approved.
- 8. Discussion and approval of Expenses. Mayor Rice asked if there were any questions or corrections to the expenses. Hearing no comments, Mayor Rice called for a vote. A motion was made by S. Perry and seconded by D. Smith. With no further discussion, Roll Call: T. Huber aye, S. Rice aye. The motion was approved.
- 9. Discussion and approval of monthly Financial Statements. Mayor Rice asked if there were any questions or corrections to the financial statements. Hearing no other comments, Mayor Rice called for a vote. A motion was made by S. Perry and seconded by D. Smith. With no further discussion, Roll Call: T. Huber aye, S. Rice aye. The motion was approved.
