# Brainerd Amateur Hockey Association Tournament Rules

Note: ZERO TOLERANCE policy enforced for spectators, players and coaches. Please be respectful.

Registration: Check-in will be in the main lobby of the Essentia Health Sports Center if not done online with tournament coordinator. This must be completed by a manager/coach 45 minutes prior to your first game. Birth Certificates (if there is not a verification stamp on the roster), Certified USA Hockey Roster, and any Player Waivers are required.

- All games will be played in accordance with USA Hockey Rules as modified by Minnesota Hockey
- 20 players may be rostered/dressed by each team per game. Maximum of 4 rostered coaches will be allowed on the bench during games.
- Each game will consist of three (3) fifteen (15) minute stop time periods. During the 3<sup>rd</sup> period running time will be used for a 6 or more goal differential scenario.
- Bantam, Peewee, 15U & 12U Every 2 periods will get an ice resurface.
- Squirt/10U Game will start with fresh ice, with no resurfacing during the game.
- Penalties We will follow the current USA Hockey penalty guidelines for each age level.
- Fighting ABSOLUTELY NO FIGHTING will be tolerated during this tournament. Referee instruction is to
  eject a player who drops his or her stick and/or gloves or otherwise engages in fighting no matter
  provocation. Referee has sole discretion regarding fighting and intent to injure which may include
  disqualification for the remainder of the tournament. At a minimum an ejection from the game and the
  next game plus a 5-minute major penalty will apply.

### **Round Robin Tournament**

- 1. Pool play will consist of a team playing the other teams from their respective pool once each to determine seeds for the final round.
- 2. Teams will earn 3 points for a Win and 1 point for a tie. NO OVERTIME FOR POOL PLAY
- 3. Below Tie Breaker Rules apply in the event of a tie in points after pool play.

## Overtime Rules (Non-Pool Play) and Tie-breaking procedures

- All pool play games on Friday and Saturday that end in a tie will not play overtime. Overtime will only be played on Sunday.
- Overtime will be considered an extension of the 3<sup>rd</sup> period and will consist of a five (5) minute, sudden death period. The period will be played 3 on 3 and with goalies.
- If a tie still remains, a 3-player shootout will determine the winning team. If still tied, a sudden death shootout will determine the winning team.
- Any player serving a penalty when the game clock expires will not be allowed to participate in the shoot-out. Also, no player will be allowed to shoot twice until all players have participated in the shoot-out.

# Tie breaking procedure for teams tied after pool play. Pool winners are seeded first, followed by Wild Card qualifiers:

- 1. Head-to-head records
- 2. Least goals allowed
- 3. Goal differential (Max of 6 per game)
- 4. Least penalty minutes
- 5. Coin toss

#### **Attention Coaches**

In order to keep the tournament running on time, please be aware of the following guidelines:

- Warm-Ups A 5-minute warmup session will be permitted before the start of the game.
   Please be ready 15 minutes prior to your scheduled game time. Game time means dropping the puck at that time. We may start early.
  - o No pucks will be allowed on the ice after the warmup session or between periods.
  - o **Exception** to warm up a goaltender after an injury
- Rest Periods Each team will get 1 timeout per game (overtime included)
- Home Team the team listed <u>SECOND</u> will be the **HOME** team and will wear white/light jerseys.

### Other Items to Note:

- \*USA Hockey facemask and mouth guard rules apply. Canadian teams must wear CAHA equipment \* Any spearing, butt ending, or intent to injure will be a 5-minute major and tournament disqualification.
- \* Any abusive language or conduct by players, coaches, or managers will result in a minor penalty plus a game misconduct. If occurrence is after the game, the offender will miss the next game.
- \* Any player who is currently a member of any High School A or B team (United States or Canada) is not allowed to play in this tournament.
- \* "Proper" Certified team roster must be submitted and approved at time of check in. Rosters are then **final**. No player may play for more than 1 team regardless of registration including goaltenders.
- \* BAHA, officials, arena operators, and all other tournament personnel shall not be held liable for any injuries sustained during this tournament.
- \* Any player or team(coach) that obtains the maximum penalty threshold during a game will be ejected, and will miss their next game as per USA Hockey rules.
- \* USA Hockey certified referees will operate under Minnesota Hockey rules. NO PROTESTS ALLOWED.
- \* Certified Medical Attendants will be at each game.
- \* Teams must compete in their registered division.
- \* All coaches must be up to date with coaching certification for the proper level they are coaching.
- \*\*\*Brainerd Hockey reserves the right to modify these rules in the event of an injury to a player or other unforeseen circumstances.
