Embracing Pomona: A Community That Shows Up

This month, we're highlighting the youth and youth programs in Pomona–a city that has played a central role in my life as a father. I have two daughters: Devynn, 28, and Tuolumne, 12. People often ask me, "Is Pomona a good place to raise children?" My answer is always simple: I raised my children in Pomona.

Yet, Pomona often gets a bad rap. I saw this firsthand at a recent fundraiser for the Optimist Club, where I met Tracy, the founder of **Healed Women Heal**. She was there with her daughters, and I was there with mine. Together, we spent the afternoon at the DA Center for Arts-painting, laughing, and enjoying our time as families.

As Tracy and I talked about real estate, she shared something familiar: She originally moved to Pomona because, as a single mother, it was the only place she could afford. When she told her mother she was moving here, her mom cried. I couldn't help but laugh—not because it was funny, but because I had lived the exact same experience. When I told my mother I was moving her three-year-old granddaughter to Pomona, she cried and begged me to reconsider.

This is a response I hear far too often from people outside the city. But after nearly 25 years as a Pomona resident, I just don't understand the fear. Like any city, we have our challenges, but tell me-what large city doesn't?

Why I Love Pomona

Pomona is more than just a place to live-it's a community that shows up for its families.

I love our **diversity**. I love that Pomona **prioritizes youth and families**. Time and again, I've seen this city rally-not just for my family, but for so many others.

Pomona has amazing parks, incredible food, and a TON of free activities for kids and families. We care so much about youth that the city overwhelmingly passed Measure Y, which requires at least 10% of general funds to be spent on youth programs. That's a commitment you don't see everywhere. So, with all that said... why do people leave?

Have You Given Pomona a Chance?

- Have you taken advantage of Pomona's free summer programs?
- Have you visited the Pomona Public Library and explored its free events?
- How often do you attend the 2nd Street Art Walk?
- Do you shop and dine in Pomona?

Too many times, when I ask my neighbors these questions, the answer is **no.**

What Community Looks Like

My daughter Devynn recently got married. Her husband is in the military, so they used a **VA loan** to purchase their home. She's a proud member of the Pomona Optimist Club, even though her restaurant is in Claremont.

Around the same time she was house-hunting, we were asked to attend a **Pomona Unified School Board meeting.**A hate group was rumored to be showing up, attempting to convince the board to reject **diversity and inclusion initiatives.**

But what happened that night?

Pomona showed up.

Hundreds of people-residents, leaders, and parents-came together to defend and protect our youth. The city spoke with one loud, unified voice: We support our children. We will not turn our backs on any child. Not now, not ever.

As we sat in that meeting, my daughter turned to me and said something that nearly brought me to tears: "I don't want to live anywhere but Pomona."

That's what community looks like. That's the kind of city where I raised my children. And that's the city where my daughter now wants to raise hers.

The Challenge: Love Your City

So, once again, I challenge you-brag about your city.

- Visit a local park and have a picnic.
- Take a free art class at the library.
- Explore a community garden.
- Eat at a Pomona restaurant instead of driving somewhere else.
- Follow The Pomona Bulletin on Facebook and Instagram to see what's happening in our city.

Oh, and Tracy? Her mother eventually got over her fear of Pomona. After seeing her daughter and grandkids **thrive** here, she did something she never expected—**she moved to Pomona herself.**

Pomona is more than what outsiders assume. It's a place of **opportunity, resilience, and community.** And I'm proud to call it home.

Visit the city's website and follow us on social media for events, renovations, and more updates. Thank you for being part of our library family—we can't wait to grow and celebrate with you in 2025!



The Mindful Advocate Mindfulness with a Purpose


"We are for them who we needed at their age."

Over 4,000 students in nearly 36 months have been supported, encouraged, and celebrated by Mia Lee and her husband John over at Conceptual Art Therapy in Pomona (https://www.conceptualarttherapy.org/ 558 West 2nd St., Studio A). Through the creation of art using a variety of art media, Ms. Mia and Mr. John, as they are affectionately referred to by their students, have mentored teen youth and transitional youth struggling to make sense of a world that may feel so outside of themselves.

Weekly art classes, weekend workshops, and multi-week summer programs may be what you expect when registering, but Conceptual Art Therapy offers so much more. While creatively designing skateboard decks in the Art On Deck program or skillfully developing photos in the Eye Opener program, our youth gain life skills and a sense of community, all within a supportive and nurturing structure. These programs also create safe spaces for storytelling, where Ms. Mia teaches healthy coping skills for the often underestimated and overlooked stress our youth face every day.

Mia and John shared their story with me—the journey of raising six children while struggling with careers and jobs that, although provided for their family, didn't quite bring them the deep joy they longed for. With John's Master of Fine Arts degree and professional photography experience, and Mia's aspiration to earn a Master's degree in Psychology to better serve youth in her community, they combined their passions in a unique artistic fusion. Thus, Conceptual Art Therapy was born and has been fostering student growth and personal development for nearly three years.

Stepping into the art studio on 2nd St., youth will find a clean skateboard, ready to be used as their canvas for unrestricted creativity.





They will be guided and encouraged to carefully design what they wish to create on their 'canvas' before implementing it. Or, they may find themselves looking up to a tall gentleman with cool, thick-rimmed black professorial glasses, ready with cameras and film to teach them how to capture the perfect shot—one that quickly becomes a window to the soul. After completing their works of art, students are given the opportunity to showcase and sell their creations, as entrepreneurship is another skill taught in these classes.



Twenty-five percent of Pomona's population consists of youth and children under the age of 18. The city has committed a portion of its annual budget to the Children and Youth Fund, which began in 2022 and increases by 1% each year until it reaches a 10% goal. The City of Pomona has put its money where its mouth is, demonstrating its commitment to serving youth and children. These funds help make many activities and programs for young people absolutely **FREE!**
