A Message from Our President

We, Dick and I, have arrived back at Hidden Springs and are happy to be here. I haven't seen a lot of folks or looked around the park since I have been busy with HOA matters. We did get tickets to the Oktoberfest on Oct. 29th hoping to meet some old and new friends there. I understand there is a deck party, happy hour, at the Golf Pro Shop on Nov. 3 starting at 4:00 p.m., which sounds like fun. There is also a Women's Golf Lunch at the Clubhouse on November 2, bring a sack lunch at 11:00 a.m. to start the new season. Women's dues this year will be \$20. Golfing that day will depend on the condition of the course, so check with the Pro Shop. That's all I know about what's going on here.

The HOA is experiencing difficulty mostly because of Covid and our being isolated. We are now trying to decide our future. All residents are invited to a meeting on Nov. 6 at 4:00 p.m. in the Clubhouse to discuss the issues. We previously planned a big dinner, but we currently have no members to put it on, so we apologize that **it will be a meeting only**. Notices have been placed in tubes reminding residents of the meeting. Members are invited to join this year for \$10 (sign-up forms will be available at the meeting). Events will be limited unless we get a Social Director Board Member and fill other open positions. Treehouse management has taken over many/most of the previous functions Maybe some others could be added. We have adequate funds in the treasury, some of it dedicated funds that members could propose for activities and/or projects (some already being dedicated to updated phonebooks). We also have other functions, besides social events, under the responsibility of Board positions currently vacant. If we do not get active members to fill existing open positions and a Nominating Committee to get volunteers for next year's positions and many new members, we may have to consider the elimination of the Hidden Springs Homeowners Association. This would not be an easy task, and we would probably have to get a lawyer to handle the proceedings. No vote will be taken at the Nov. 6 meeting, nor probably the December meeting because we need members to join and snowbirds from Canada are not allowed to come until after Nov/ 7. Only HOA members can vote on the dissolution of the HOA and 30-days notice of the vote must be given to members.

We have many new residents with new interests, many still working and more full-timers than ever before. We may need a change. An updated community phonebook/directory, as promised, is in

MEDICARE ASSISTANCE

Dick Anderson is a volunteer Medicare counselor, certified by the California Department of Aging since 2007. He provides free counseling, information on all things having to do with Medicare, and Medicare-related subjects. Dick does not sell anything, ever. All his services are free. He also helps with problems and complaints or appeals if you feel your plan is not providing a benefit you need.

During the months of January, February and March, there is a special Medicare enrollment period for people who have Medicare advantage plans and who are interested in changing plans or dropping out of their plan and returning to original Medicare. Dick also has information on getting help with Medicare costs and Extra Help with Prescription Drugs for people on limited incomes. This year there are also special savings plans for people using insulin for diabetic maintenance.
