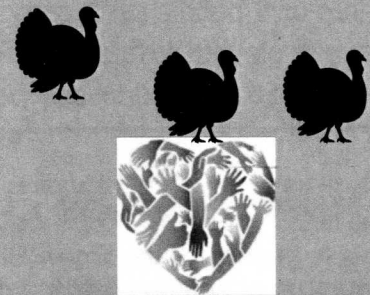
THANKSGIVING DINNER

You can almost watch the grass grow daily, it's a beautiful velvet green !!

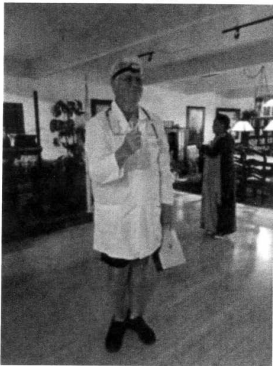
I hope you all are able to attend HOA meetings and A.J.'s D&D's meeting this coming Season. These meetings are an important information source for Park concerns and events.
