







Wall Tile # PMCP4692 Size 12x12




Wall Tile # PMCP4675B Size 12x12

When choosing exterior tile, balance style, durability, and safety from the start. Exterior tiles are made to endure weather and heavy use, but not every finish is right for every application; polished tiles are typically reserved for interior floors because their glossy surface can be hazardous outdoors. Exterior tiles commonly come in sizes such as 12x12, 16x16, 18x18, and 24x24 inches (and larger-format planks and slabs for patios and terraces). Larger matte tiles often cost more than smaller or polished options, so budget accordingly when planning large areas.

Safety is essential: select tiles with a textured or slip-resistant finish (or ask about anti-slip treatments) to reduce the risk of falls in wet conditions. Proper installation — correct slope for drainage, suitable adhesives, and grout joint size — also plays a big role in long-term performance. For materials, porcelain is a popular outdoor choice due to its low porosity and durability, while natural stone offers unique character but may need periodic sealing.

Maintenance is straightforward but important: sweep away grit, wash with mild soap and water, and avoid harsh acidic cleaners that can damage surfaces or grout. Inspect grout lines and reseal grout or natural stone as recommended by the manufacturer to prevent water infiltration and staining. With the right finish, installation, and upkeep, exterior tile will deliver lasting elegance, safety, and curb appeal
