



ADHD Symptom Checklist for Children

Inattention Symptoms	
<input type="checkbox"/>	Careless Mistakes: Makes careless errors in schoolwork and activities due to lack of attention to details.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Sustaining Attention: Has difficulty sustaining attention in tasks or play activities.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Listening Issues: Does not seem to listen when spoken to directly.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Following Instructions: Fails to follow through on instructions and fails to finish schoolwork or chores.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Task Organization: Has trouble organizing tasks and activities.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Avoids Mental Effort: Avoids or dislikes tasks requiring sustained mental effort.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Loses Necessary Items: Often loses items needed for tasks and activities (e.g., school materials).
<input type="checkbox"/>	Easily Distracted: Is easily distracted by extraneous stimuli.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Forgetfulness in Daily Activities: Is often forgetful in daily activities.
Hyperactivity-Impulsivity Symptoms	
<input type="checkbox"/>	Blurting Out Answers: Blurts out an answer before a question has been completed.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Difficulty Sitting Still: Has trouble sitting still, fidgets with hands or feet, or squirms in seat.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Leaves Seat Inappropriately: Leaves seat in situations when remaining seated is expected.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Inappropriate Running/Climbing: Runs about or climbs in situations where it is inappropriate.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Unable to Play Quietly: Has difficulty playing or engaging quietly in leisure activities.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Excessive Energy: Seems driven by a motor, unable to stay still for extended periods.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Excessive Talking: Talks excessively.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Difficulty Waiting Turns: Has trouble waiting his/her turn.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Interrupting/Intruding: Interrupts or intrudes on others (e.g., butts into conversations or games).
Combined Type	
<input type="checkbox"/>	Displays both sets of symptoms: Shows significant signs from both the inattention and hyperactivity-impulsivity lists.
Additional Considerations	
<input type="checkbox"/>	Age of Onset: Symptoms must have been present before the age of 12.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Multiple Settings: Symptoms are observable in two or more settings (e.g., at school and at home).
<input type="checkbox"/>	Impact on Functioning: The symptoms interfere with, or reduce the quality of, social, school, or work functioning.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Differentiation from Other Disorders: Symptoms are not better explained by another mental disorder (e.g., Mood Disorders, Anxiety Disorders).
