



The Early Years in Cudjoe Gardens

(Excerpt from an article by John Viele)

In 1976, there were about thirty or forty houses in the Gardens. All except a few were located on the east side of Drost Drive plus about a dozen between Sawyer Drive and Colson Drive. There were no houses, no utility poles, and very little else on 8th and 9th Avenues. You could see the American Shoal Lighthouse from 7th Avenue West. All the canals had been dug except those on the west side of Drost Drive between what is now 1st and 5th Ave's W. That area, still in its natural state, was covered with mangrove thickets and shallow tidal swamps.

To give the canals smooth sidewalls, trenching machines cut ditches on both sides before any digging took place. Next, dynamite charges loosened the material in between the sidewalls. The excavators planted the dynamite sticks in a series pattern so that they exploded in a ripple fashion instead of a single large blast. A dragline operator would then dredge out the limestone rubble and deposit it in large piles alongside the canals. Later bulldozers spread the fill to create new higher land as a base for home construction. Vincent Drost, the man with the vision for Cudjoe Gardens, was careful to prevent silt from spreading into Bow Channel as the canals were being dug. In 1976, there was a "plug" at the northern end of the perimeter canal (7th and 8th Ave's W) installed for this purpose.

Drost was determined to make his development a true garden spot. He carefully preserved all the native trees and discovered that even if they were covered with fill from the canals, they would continue to thrive. He planted native palm trees at the boundaries between lots and tied mangrove seed pods (called "cigars") to the rocks along the outer edge of the perimeter canal which took root and grew to form an attractive mangrove border.

Billie Drost, Vince's wife, approved all plans for homes in the Gardens, and was sometimes contracted to design and draw plans, and oversee construction for Cudjoe Gardens homes. While waiting for the builders to finish, some early residents rented temporary quarters in the "Flagler" house on US 1 and the Club 800 (now a restaurant) next to the marina.

With so few residents, everyone knew everyone. If someone gave a party, just about everybody in the Gardens would be there. The Club 800 was completed in 1974 and before it was leased to restaurant operators, Garden-wide parties would be held there on holidays. Other local eateries like Captain Eddie's Fish Basket (now Mangrove Mama's), Pieces of Eight (was Coco's Cantina), and the Sandpiper Bar (was the Old Road Cafe) were places where hermit crab races were held every weekend and just about everyone came with their favorite crab.

In the late 1970's, a group of resident boat owners, tired of running aground trying to find their way into the Gardens, banded together to install markers along the natural channels. Working from a homemade catamaran, they pounded rebar into the bottom



of the water, lowered PVC pipes over the rebar, and then poured cement down the pipe. Red or green signs, as appropriate, were fastened to the top of the PVC pipes. These markers served their purpose well until the County installed regular channel markers in the 1990's.

Much has changed in the forty years that have passed. Many of these changes have been for the benefit of everyone, such as growth and development of The Cudjoe Gardens Property Owners Association. Cudjoe Gardens remains one of the finest places to call home in the Florida Keys!


