

Miracles and Memories Academy, in Monroe, WA, is designed to support families of individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. We provide community-based respite care. Our services are intended to support families, continue with life, work, shopping or to just get a break from caring for their family member. During summer we also provide summer camps for children who attend school K - 12.

The Owner/Provider states - "I started the Academy as my ministry. One of the needs that I saw in our community was the lack of faith based services for individuals with disabilities. Many families in that situation turn from God because they're angry that their children have these issues. All of my staff are followers of Jesus and we weave in hope and joy and God's love everyday. We pray for our clients and we pray for our staff. We work really hard to show the love of Jesus to the families in everything that we do."
