Service Project: Penny's Place



Northwest Family Life provides hope and healing to survivors by breaking the cycles of abuse, exploitation, and relational trauma. They provide services such as safe shelter, counseling, domestic violence intervention treatment, soulcare, and advocacy. The organization includes a network of 40+ faith based therapists that are dedicated to a unique 3 pronged approach to services: (1) Providing victim services (including for the youth who are impacted) (2) Providing rehabilitative treatment to perpetrators and, (3) Providing training for faith communities.

Through this work, NWFL hopes to create generational change. The NWFL team writes, "We are so excited to partner with you all. We all need to work together to create healing in our communities. Thank you for being ambassadors of hope and "shade in the daytime from the heat, a place of refuge, and a shelter from the storm and rain"" (Isaiah 4:6).

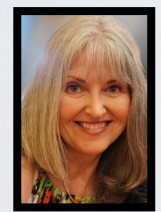

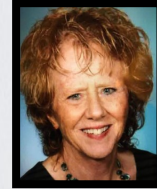


Without the "Test", All You Are is a "Mony"

Donna is an amazing storyteller and will be sharing her testimony, and encouraging us with humor and love.

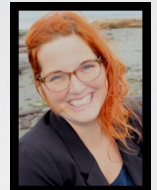

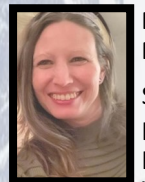

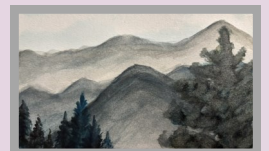
