









MILDRED EMMONS AND VINEYARD CHRISTIAN FELLOWSHIP FRAMINGHAM

The Vineyard is Lynne and Kim's home church and has long been a staunch supporter of Agape's work. But Mildred Emmons took it a step further - literally. Last spring, she came up with the idea of an **Agape Easter Walk**. She did all the planning and administrative work for the walk, including

organizing a team to develop walker packets with sponsorship forms and Agape information. On Palm Sunday, she kicked off the walk with the "Agape Walk Band" and walkers set off on a 3 mile course around the church. Walkers contacted family, friends and co-workers to ask for sponsorship support – last year's walk introduced 100+ new people to Agape!

Mildred is at it again – the second annual Agape Easter Walk at VCF took place Sunday, April 1, 2007. When asked why

she wanted to organize the walk, Mildred said "I was looking for an inexpensive, fun fundraiser that would easily involve the whole church family. Costs of running the Walk are minimal with all donations going directly to Agape. Adding a "free lunch" for everyone after service that day makes for a great all-church "feel good" gathering!"

ERIC SONNICHSEN AND TEST DEVICES, INC.

Eric Sonnichsen first heard about Agape when Kim presented to Memorial Congregational Church in Sudbury during a Sunday service. MCC is another church that is a committed supporter of Agape's work. The church currently sponsors one of our HIV positive children, Swathi, and has completed clothes drives, and holiday fundraising for Agape. Eric responded immediately to the call for help and his company, Test Devices of Hudson MA is now sponsoring a full orphanage (\$15,000 a year).

We are privileged to be able to contribute in a small way to the important work this organization performs."

Eric's wife, Barbara Fleming, also shares a desire to help Agape. Barbara is a nurse who worked with AIDS babies when the AIDS crisis first hit in the US. She recalls, "almost all of the babies died. We didn't know how to treat them. It was a very difficult time and I imagine it isn't much different in India right now." We are grateful for the support of Eric, Barbara and Test Devices.


