

It is time to start planning for
A Home of Our Own!

The day to day busyness of running Agape can fill every waking moment of my day. And as exhausting as it can be, that is a good thing because it means Agape is alive, meeting the needs of the orphans and continuing to grow! So it is important to consciously take time to come away from all the things that must be done and see what it is that should or could be done for the future of Agape and our kids.

After more than 13 years here in India, I have learned a thing or two about the growing pains of opening multiple sites, navigating the bureaucratic systems and laws in place, and how the culture can work for and against us. I also see the kids growing and their needs changing as they age. I have to look ahead to consider how Agape can meet those needs and help them transition into society.

So it is time to look ahead and see what Agape needs for the next five years; what could be possible, what dreams and visions I could implement or begin planning. Let me share with you some of ideas I have dared to hope God will bring into reality.

I have begun looking for a large, spacious lot of land; about seven acres would be wonderful. If Agape



owned a large lot of land, we would have a stable space for the growth that is coming. Agape would not be at the mercy of landlords, or have to worry about relocating if they decide to sell or lease to others. We could build the buildings we need and make repairs in a timely manner and not have to rely on a landlord's schedule or resources. We also would not have to worry about sudden rent increases.

A large lot would allow us to own a school building with plenty of classrooms; computer, science and audio visual labs; a library; and quiet places for our college students to study. The many donated supplies we use at our rented school can be used to customise each room for maximum benefit for our students.

We could build housing for 500 orphans right on campus instead of having multiple locations to deal with and busing the kids to and from school daily. It would also allow us to consolidate our house parents, cooks, and staff into one place and give them the support of each other so they are no longer alone at their outpost.

A lot of land that is all our own could allow the Agape office to be right on campus with everything else. The lot could be gated for security, and a playground put in for all the kids to play safely. There would be space for an event hall for meals, special parties, assemblies, celebrations, Skype communications during US events, weddings (our kids are getting to that age!) and so much more!

There would be space for us to put in a utilities building to relocate and house the water treatment equipment and high capacity laundering equipment donated to us.

We could put in housing for staff, Agape students who have graduated and want to stay on to work at Agape, teachers and cooks that live far away, and of course space for our house parents to live when not on duty.

For our graduates who aren't college bound or who do not qualify, there would be space for a much needed trade training center, workshops, and even possibly a junior college.

This would make a big difference as the number of kids entering the junior college level is increasing every

year, with Agape possibly having 14 students ready to continue on to junior college next year! In India, after you complete high school (10th class) you are required to attend a junior college for two years (equivalent to grades 11 & 12 in the US schools) before you can go on to a bachelors degree program.

All these added facilities can help our students either prepare for college, or learn a trade such as wood working, sewing, mehndi, jewelery or craft making that can provide them with an income later. We could then begin to develop a placement center to help our graduates find jobs that will sustain them and give them a profitable future.

A large lot of our own would allow us to use part of the land to help generate income for Agape and even sustain our nutrition needs by growing things like fruit trees, Teak trees – a valuable wood – and vegetable or flower gardens. This

would give the kids an opportunity to learn about sustainable resources and agriculture.

We could also begin to teach

them about renewable energy sources and have our buildings fitted with a complete solar array panels for our own energy needs and energy conservation. Given low water tables in the state and many areas without water (including two of our current buildings), we could dig deeper bore wells and implement a rain water harvesting plan.

We would also be able to consolidate our current upkeep efforts and utility

expenses we currently spend using multiple sites now.

A large lot of land will allow us to develop a campus atmosphere and a place that Agape kids can always come home to and be proud to say "this is where I grew up; this is the place that gave me a hope and future."
