If the school is community eligible, consider adding that language to the policy. If not, can you include <u>how</u> the school protects the privacy of students who qualify for free-and-reduced-price lunch (FRPL) , how <u>unpaid</u> meal balances are handled without stigmatizing students, and/or <u>how</u> families are provided information about FRPL?

The school *already avoids competitive foods during the school day*, so items NS1-8 were

not applicable! Consider adding Smart Snacks Standards for all foods and beverages offered (served or sold) before and/or after school.

This is another very comprehensive section!

Physical Education (PE) & Physical Activity

Where feasible, the school may wish to add language about:

- Using a written, standards-based PE curriculum.
- Family engagement opportunities in physical activities with students (ex., field days).
- The amount of time provided for daily recess for elementary students.

Wellness Promotion & Marketing

 To remain compliant with federal and state standards, the school may wish to add that any food and beverage <u>marketing</u> on the school campus must meet the USDA's Smart Snacks guidelines, including on school property, in educational materials, where food is purchased, in school media, and/or in fundraisers.

The District may also wish to consider adding strategies to support employee wellness.

Implementation, Evaluation & Communication

This section already meets nearly all of federal and state requirements for Local Wellness Policies. Note that policy reviews around compliance and implementation can be done triennially. To complete adherence with federal and state requirements, the policy can include that triennial policy reviews:
