

Introduction to Prophecy

This prophecy course has been designed to educate the reader and enable them to understand the prophecies that have been fulfilled as well as those that are being fulfilled in our present day. They are presented in sequential order so that you can start and progress in order, beginning with lesson 01 – 14, and they cover both Daniel and Revelation by addressing the prophecy subjects in both books.

The book of Daniel can be seen as a manual for history and prophecy. Predictive prophecy offers a preview of future events; in turn, history acts as a form of foretelling that unfolds over time. This aspect of prediction helps God’s followers view temporal events through the lens of eternity, guides them to act wisely at the right moments, assists in personal readiness for the ultimate crisis, and gives a solid foundation for faith when predictions come true.

Read the book of Daniel. Trace, step by step, the history of each kingdom depicted. Observe statesmen, councils, and mighty armies, and see how God works to humble pride and reduce human glory to dust. Only God is shown as truly great. In the prophet’s vision, He is seen overthrowing one powerful ruler and installing another. He is portrayed as the ruler of the universe, about to establish His eternal kingdom—the Ancient of Days, the living God, the source of all wisdom, the ruler of the present, and the revealer of the future. Read and grasp how fragile, short-lived, mistaken, and guilty mortals are.

Daniel's divine light was granted specifically for these final days. The visions he experienced by the banks of the Ulai and Hiddekel, the mighty rivers of Shinar, are now being fulfilled, and all the prophetic events will soon occur.
