- 2. Little children keep yourselves from idols. 1John 5:21, Acts 17:29
- 3. That the name of God and His doctrine be not blasphemed. 1Tim. 6:1
- 4. The Sabbath was made for man and not man for the Sabbath. Therefore the son of man is Lord also of the Sabbath. Mk. 2:27,28; Heb. 4:4
- 5. Honor thy father and thy mother. Mt. 19:19; Eph. 6:1-3
- 6. Thou shall not kill. Rm. 13:9; Jm. 2:11
- 7. Thou shall not commit adultery. Mt. 19:18
- 8. Thou shall not steal. Rm. 13:9; Eph. 4:20
- 9. Thou shall not bear false witness. Rm. 13:9
- 10. Thou shall not covet. Rm. 7:7

The law that was done away with was the ceremonial law of sacrifices and offerings, due to the atonement of Christ Jesus that did away with the sacrificial system that pointed to Him. Besides, if the law could be changed or done away with, God would have changed it, and Jesus Christ would have never had to die on the cross for us.
