BALLET

Ballet is a foundation of all dance, achieved through barre and center floor work, with a focused attention to proper alignment, technique, and artistry. Students are classically trained with an emphasis on challenging each dancer to the highest degree of technical and artistic excellence – appropriate for their ability level

CHEER

Our cheer program involves a team of individuals where members learn to dance, stunt, jump and tumble to high-energy music.

COMBO CLASS

This class blends various dance styles, giving young dancers a well-rounded introduction to multiple genres and teaching them to memorize choreography with precision, style, and dynamics.

COMPETITION

Competition brings inspiration! Having the opportunity to watch other dancers is imperative to improving technique and performance. Being exposed to new ideas and ways of moving is essential for your dancer's progress.

DANCE TEAM PREP

This course will better prepare students trying out for their school's dance team by focusing on dance technique, jumps/leaps, stretching/conditioning, & performance tips.

HIP HOP

Hip Hop refers to street dance style primarily performed to hip-hop music. It includes a wide range of styles primarily breaking, locking, and popping.

LYRICAL

A dance style that embodies various aspects of ballet, jazz, acrobatics, and modern dance.

MOMMY & ME

An introduction to dance where our toddlers learn motor skills, listening, stretching, & tumbling!

POINTE

Pointe class is a demanding ballet technique that requires dancers to dance on the tips of their toes, supported by pointe shoes. Approval from the faculty is necessary prior to enrollment.

PAYMENTS

WHERE TO TURN IN PAYMENTS? You may drop payments in the Lobby_mailbox that is checked daily! Classes will not be stopped to receive payments, issue change, or check balances.

PAYMENT PROCEDURE?

- 1.) Please include your child's name, class title, & type of payment (i.e. tuition, costume deposit, etc.) on all checks turned into the studio to avoid any confusion on the status of your account.
- 2.) Payments in the form of a check/money order may be mailed.
DO NOT MAIL CASH or MONEY ORDERS
- 3.) Cash/Check/Money Order only. (No paypal, cash app, etc)

NSF Payments: NSF on paper checks, will incur a \$20 NSF fee along with the original payment due. If I receive 2 NSF checks on a dancer's account a credit card will be required to be on file.

TUITION FEES:

- 1.) Due on the 1st of each month-with a 10 day grace period.
- 2.) \$10 late fee applies if paid after the 10th of the month.
- 3.) Tuition applies even if a student is absent payment week, regardless of reason.
- 4.) If payment status falls 2 months behind, the student will not be able to continue lessons until account is current.
- 5.) Monthly tuition, costume fees, revue fees and registration fees are NON REFUNDABLE

COSTUME FEES:

Each costume fee is \$90 and is due on the 10th of the month. Costume deposit payments begin in August. All Costume Fees are NON-REFUNDABLE.

- 1.) Costume fees include: 1 costume, tights, gloves & other similar accessories, and shipping. If tights are lost or ripped, the correct type must be purchased from the studio for \$10. Body Tights are \$15. (Fishnet prices vary)
- 2.) Costumes will not be ordered if your account is not up-to-date at the time costumes are ordered in October. No exceptions. If account balance becomes current after group costumes are ordered, your costumes may be ordered with a shipping charge and no guarantee that it will arrive in time for pictures or the revue.
- 3.) Costumes will not be handed out at the Costume Meetings to anyone with any type of outstanding balance with the studio.
- 4.) NO RETURNS/NO EXCHANGES (costume company policy)
- 5.) You are responsible for any alterations (if necessary)

CLASSROOM ETTIQUETTE

STUDENT ENTRANCE PROCEDURE

- 1.) BE SURE A TEACHER IS IN CLASSROOM
- 2.) Ask teacher what shoes are 1st – Change shoes
- 3.) Place bag in cubby holes
- 4.) Use the Restroom
- 5.) Sit Quietly on your dot

STUDENT CLASSROOM RULES

- 1.) **Cell phone USE is NOT allowed in class.** Cell phones should be turned off prior to classes and saved in students bags. Teachers may collect phone at the beginning of class.
- 2.) **NO FOOD OR DRINKS ALLOWED IN STUDIO.** Water only. If students are eating afternoon snack, they must finish outside and throw in outside classroom.
- 3.) **Dancers NEVER run in the studio.** You will fall & hurt yourself
- 4.) **Dancers NEVER chew gum/dance with candy.** You can choke
- 5.) **Dancers NEVER put their fingers in their nose or mouth.** During class you will place your hands on the floor, and sometimes hold hands with a dance classmate. You won't spread germs if you don't put your fingers in your nose or mouth.
- 6.) **Dancers NEVER hang on the barre.** You could fall & hurt yourself
- 7.) **Dancers LISTEN and DO NOT talk out of turn.**
- 8.) **Dancers go to the RESTROOM BEFORE class.**
- 9.) **Dancers give 110% ALL THE TIME!**
- 10.) **Dancers ARE NOT quitters.** They try & try again!
- 11.) **Dancers are DEDICATED.** They only miss class if they are sick, or there is an emergency
- 12.) **Dancers who PAY ATTENTION, LISTEN, and FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS will be rewarded at the end of class.**
- 13.) **BULLYING/MEAN GIRLING WILL NOT BE TOLERATED!**
- 14.) **SAVE YOUR ATTITUDE for the dance floor!**

STUDIO RULES

LOST & FOUND Dance World will assume no responsibility for lost items. Unidentified and unclaimed items will periodically be given to charitable organizations.

LABEL YOUR ITEMS All dance items should be labeled with the student's name including their shoes and dance bags.

DRESS CODE is very important in dance class for instructors to see proper body alignment & posture to make corrections and avoid injuries to dancers. No Jewelry! Your dance schedule is consistent every week so plan ahead and organize your attire ahead of time.

THE SWAP BOX is located in the lobby. When you place a pair of outgrown shoes in the box, you may take a pair out. Please do not throw your old shoes away. Someone may be able to use them.

MISBEHAVOIR

Excessive talking or other misbehavior will not be tolerated and may result in the student being asked to observe class instead of participate. Parents will be notified with excessive misbehavior and dismal (without a refund) can be a result of disciplinary action

CLASSES ARE NOT TO BE INTERRUPTED. Only participating students are allowed to enter the classroom. Parents, Friends, and siblings can be a distraction during class time, so they are only allowed in classroom during observation hours.

I. **Younger Students (primary – kindergarten):**

Enter: Parents may enter class with dancers and assist with shoes, then leave immediately.

Exit: Parents should enter the dance classroom to pick children up.

PARENT DROP OFF/PICK UP

- 1.) Students can be dropped off 5 minutes before class & must be picked up immediately after.
- 2.) Make sure a teacher is in the classroom before leaving your child
- 3.) If you have younger students, please bring them to the restrooms BEFORE class
- 4.) Fee of \$1 per minute beginning 10 minutes after class has ended will be added to your account if students are picked up late.
- 5.) For safety reasons, we would like parents to get down to pick up their children.
- 6.) ABSOLUTELY NO WAITING IN THE PARKING LOT!

ATTENDANCE

ATTENDANCE EXPLANATION/ETIQUETTE

- 1.) This policy will also be strictly enforced. Role will be taken each class (BandApp)
- 2.) Any student missing class must notify EACH instructor via BandApp prior to class.
- 3.) At times, absences cannot be avoided; however, intentionally missing class is unfair to the remainder of the class because progress is slowed down.
- 4.) If a student is injured for an extended period of time but plans to return to class: Students must still attend class and take notes during their healing process
- 5.) Dr. Excuses should be submitted to EACH instructor via band app so we have a documented paper trail.

ATTENDANCE POLICY

- 1.) Any student with **SEVEN** unexcused absences will not be allowed to perform in the revue.
- 2.) Any student missing **FOUR** consecutive dance classes (whether excused or unexcused) must withdraw from dance class.
- 3.) Any student missing **THREE** or more classes AFTER January 1st (whether excused or unexcused), must schedule (& pay extra) for Private Lessons (\$30/ ½ hr) or forfeit their participation in our annual dance recital.
- 4.) Any student missing partial or entire “**Mandatory**” practice (whether excused or unexcused), must schedule (& pay extra) for Private Lessons (\$30/ ½ hr) or forfeit their participation in that dance.

UNEXCUSED VS. EXCUSED

- 1.) Unexcused absences consist of school meetings or trips, extracurricular activities, homework, vacations, etc.
- 2.) Excused absences consist of illness or a death in the family.
- 3.) Arriving 30 minutes late to class is considered an absence.
- 4.) Leaving 30 minutes early is considered an absence

WITHDRAWAL FROM STUDIO OR CLASS

PARENT WITHDRAWAL PROCEDURE.

- 1.) One-month notice from the first of the month is required to discontinue any payments.
 - 2.) To withdraw a parent must inform the studio in person/writing.
- *Note:** Any payments previously made are NON REFUNDABLE. All charges will stop after the one-month notice period
