## **Junior Counselor in Training (JCIT) Expectations**



JCITs are kids coming out of 6<sup>th</sup> or 7<sup>th</sup> grade who work alongside jr. counselors and counselors to watch and play with campers. This is a great opportunity for the child to learn how to be a responsible employee. They are expected to fill out their own application, take part in an interview, and communicate to leadership on their own. They are NOT paid for their first year of being a JCIT. Some parents choose to compensate their kids, because they aren't paying for childcare.

- Full summer commitment, at least 3 days a week, 8 hours a day, with the exception of one vacation week
- JCITs are expected to be a fully responsible employee. They need to communicate any absences or sickness, etc. Their parents should not do this for them.
- In the instance of a sick day, the JCIT should contact leadership as soon as possible.
- JCITs do NOT discipline children. If there is any conflict, they will bring the campers to a counselor who can escalate the situation to the director if needed.
- JCITs may be asked to help with chores around camp such as sweeping, mopping, emptying trash cans, refilling water containers, serving food, distributing snacks, etc.
- JCITs will be assigned to a group of kids. They are expected to keep track of and watch the kids as they transition through rotations and activities. This includes accounting for children/attendance, instructing kids on current directions, and assisting with activities.
- JCITs are allowed to swim two times a week. There will be a set schedule.
- JCITs are expected to stay with their campers. They are not to wander the camp, hide with other counselors to chat, or sit inside the buildings alone.
- The behavior and work ethic that is shown by JCITs will determine whether they are offered a job the summer after their 8<sup>th</sup> grade year.
