The St. Hubert Alumnae craft show took place on Saturday, October 25th, 2025. With the help of the Bambie Ambassadors and Alumnae volunteers, we were able to host over 50 vendors. These vendors sold holiday decorations, handmade jewelry, other crafts, and homemade treats.

Among the many talented participants, some were especially unique. Some notable vendors we would like to highlight are :

The Bear Lady - Affectionately nicknamed by her children, Stephanie Burke creates custom teddy bears and St. Hubert ornaments and routinely sells them at the craft fair.

Tick...Tick...Tick

Are you 70 ½ years old or older and thinking about taking your annual 2025 Required Minimum Distribution (RMD)? You can make a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from an eligible IRA directly to Friends of St. Hubert (FOSH) and it counts toward your RMD. QCD's can be an excellent way to fulfill RMDs while also supporting FOSH. For Pennsylvania – and many other states– and Federal tax purposes, QCDs are not counted as income.

For your QCD check to count for the current tax year, it must be cashed by FOSH before December 31st. If the check is not cashed by that deadline, it will not count as a QCD for that year and the distribution may be treated as a regular, taxable IRA distribution. It is best for the check to reach FOSH no later than mid-December or to use a direct transfer to ensure it is processed in time.

Consult your tax advisor to learn the tax advantages of making a QCD to FOSH and whether your IRA distribution qualifies as a QCD.
