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BAMBIE BOLT - IN INDIANA

For many alumnae, the St. Hubert experience lives on long after graduation. For Peggy Gallagher, (SH '89) memories of blue jumpers, saddle shoes, Father-Daughter Dances, and warm cheese fries in the cafeteria are still vivid today.

"I loved my uniform," she recalled. "The colorful 'SH' patches for each year, my locker key, and the rick-rack trim ribbon. It made mornings easy because I never had to think about what to wear. And the Father-Daughter Dances were so special—not just for me, but for my dad, too. He loved to dance."

This year, she's carrying those Bambie memories forward in a new way—by joining the Bambie Bolt 5K for the first time. Though she hasn't participated in alumnae events before, she was excited to see the race promoted on Facebook. As a seasoned runner who has completed more than two dozen 5Ks, multiple longer races, and even a Warrior Mud Run, she saw the Bolt as both a challenge and a homecoming.

Peggy will complete her virtual race on the Nickel Plate Trail near her home in Fishers, Indiana, just outside Indianapolis. "I usually walk three miles four times a week, so I'm adding in running to train," she explained. "I'll be running solo with

my playlist, using the RunKeeper App to track my miles, time, and pace. And of course, I'll be wearing my Bambie Bolt t-shirt—and maybe my St. Hubert hoodie if it's chilly."

Running is more than exercise for her—it's a way to support causes and collect memories. She runs unique trails, supports worthy causes, and loves interesting medals. "It's always gratifying when I finish."

But participating in the Bambie Bolt means something deeper: connection. "It's important to be proud of, remember, and support where you came from," she shared. "Events like this make me feel connected to my high school, my hometown, and the Philadelphia community. Even though I still get homesick sometimes, the Bambie Bolt is a way to stay connected throughout the year."

She also believes in giving back to empower today's students. "It's important to support St. Hubert however you can to encourage the next generation. Young women should be brave, let their voices be heard, think outside the box, and not let anyone hold them back from pursuing their dreams."

With every step of her 5K in Indiana, she'll be carrying the heart of Philly, her St. Hubert pride, and the Bambie spirit.
