REMEMBERING SISTER ALMA ROSE SCHLOSSER, SSJ

The St. Hubert community mourns the loss of a beloved leader, mentor, and visionary, Sister Alma Rose Schlosser, SSJ, who passed away on April 23, 2026, at age 83. A proud member of the Class of 1960, she first walked the halls of St. Hubert as a student before returning as its President, dedicating her life to the school that shaped her.



Sister Alma was a passionate advocate for all-girls education and its power to form young women into leaders. Her guiding words, "Becoming Women of Faith and Integrity," were not simply a motto—they were a standard she lived and instilled in her students.

Those who knew her remember a leader both compassionate and

strong—someone who supported others while challenging them to grow. She welcomed dialogue, stood firm in her convictions, and led with wisdom and heart. In recognition of her impact, she was inducted into the St. Hubert Hall of Fame in 2013.

As Trish Dougherty Decker ('81) shared, "Sister Alma Rose embodied the heart of the Sisters of St. Joseph and her alma mater...her legacy lives on in all the Bambies."

Sister Alma's legacy lives on in the generations she guided, the community she strengthened, and the values she championed. She saw potential in her students—even before they saw it in themselves. She is survived by her siblings, extended family, and her SSJ Sisters.

Each inductee demonstrated how a St. Hubert education continues to shape lives long after graduation. **Colleen Ott '96** was recognized for her artistic vision; **Bernadette Dickson Laukaitis '96** for her dedication to athletics and mentorship; **Kathleen Price Hertkorn '88** brought distinction to the business world through principled leadership, while **Rita Kelly Fitzgerald '74** was honored for a lifetime commitment to community service. Our Christus Vincit honoree, **Roseanne O'Hanlon Duzinski '67**, represented faith lived with consistency and courage. **Patricia Peyton '80**, acknowledged for philanthropy and volunteer service, reminded us how generosity strengthens communities and institutions.

Altogether, the event raised an impressive \$2,261, with every dollar going directly toward supporting students at our beloved alma mater.

from the 2010s joining in, often bringing friends and family members along. This blend of generations created a lively and welcoming atmosphere throughout the event.

Some alumnae organized/multi-generational tables, including Michelle Gill ('79) who organized one of the largest alumnae-based tables representing classes from 1956, 1979, and 1983. Efforts like these played a significant role in making the event such a success.
