Before the Wedding...


Get ready to explore, brainstorm, and make those first crucial decisions that will set the stage for your unforgettable day.

DO YOUR RESEARCH,

Find out what you need to get married. Locate the county clerk and obtain your marriage license.

(Don't wait too late-most will expire after 90 days)





TIMING IS EVERYTHING,

Start thinking about what time of year you would like to marry. (This helps narrow your window to a few months)

Think of the themes (summer luau, winter wonderland, traditional spring, etc) Remember-certain seasons such as spring can be more expensive and difficult to book.

Make a Plan. Start a vision board with your sweetheart.

This guide will help you get started but it's better to work with a professional like a registered wedding officiant, wedding planner or coordinator. Wedding professionals such as these, will be able to assist in creating your vision by connecting you with industry partners who can provide their services such as florists and venues.

Before the Wedding ...

BUDGET

Eloping doesn't mean your wedding won't be elegant.

There are many options that can save money you may want to use later. Think of putting extra money towards a honeymoon, house, or even a savings account.

You can save thousands by renting over buying your attire. You can use artificial flowers which can be both an economical and environmental choice.

Even choosing a location can be a decision that can be made frugally. Think of options such as an intimate dinner party celebration, where your family and friends can attend without the need for accommodations of a rented space.

Location, Location, Location.

Is there a family home? Favorite hiking spot? On the beach? In the mountains? Wherever you two decide, make sure it speaks to your unique love story.

(Remember elopements are typically less than 10 people.

Now is the time to have a discussion about who you will tell and how.)

Some places may require permits or have dates/times that are restricted. Always do your research.

VENDORS

You'll need the services of qualified and trusted wedding vendors. In order for your marriage to be legal, you'll need an officiant to perform your ceremony and sign your marriage license.

Always check with your state's requirements for officiants/celebrants. A registered officiant can show validation of credentials upon request. Always look for reviews.

OTHER VENDORS

Wedding officiants and planners usually have a recommended vendor list of trusted partners they work with. There are even combination discounts available sometimes. With an elopement, you may only need a photographer, florist, and venue in addition to an officiant. But it is always good to have these vendors on hand for a later celebration. Remember to think of how these options will affect your budget.



During the Wedding ...



After doing all the hard work, you are finally ready to enjoy this special occasion. A wedding can seem pretty frantic but I will give you some pointers on the ceremony and what to expect.

TIPS

- Have your valid ID/DL or acceptable proof of identity
- Bring a wedding emergency kit (tiny sewing kit, safety pins, hair pins, bandaids, tissue and other handy dandies)
- Make sure to bring a charger (clear space for photos and videos)
- Don't forget your plus 1 (most states require at least one witness 18+)
- · Check the weather and traffic

During the Wedding ...

ENTRANCE

- Family first (Before the music, the family should come in and assemble (Bride's family=left/Groom=right EXCEPT ESCORT OF THE BRIDE- if available, they will walk the bride in later. If doing an elopement or small ceremony without a wedding party, everyone will come in and be seated. The bride remains out of sight until cued in)
- GROOM/GROOMSMEN (will come down to altar and assemble to the right)
- BRIDESMAIDS (will come down and assemble to the left-can be done to musical intro but NOT wedding march)
- OFFICIANT (will enter and stand in center. Upon cue, officiant will ask assembly to be seated and cue WEDDING MARCH-if music will be used.)
- FLOWERCHILDREN (if flowerchildren are used, they should enter here, moving swiftly down the aisle.

 Please consider age and temperament of child)
- BRIDE (The bride should be out of sight until flowerchildren have cleared the aisle. Bride will enter with escort or upon cue) The officiant will ask "who will give this person away?" The escort will answer "I will." and be seated to the right. (If no wedding party/escort-bride will enter on cue and stand to the right.)

During the Wedding...

CEREMONY

- INTRO (The officiant will start by asking everyone to be seated announcing the parties to be married. Some officiants may insert a special reading.)
- **VOWS** (At this point, the couple may now read their vows one after the other.)
- DECLARATION OF INTENT (DECLARATION OF INTENT is asked by the officiant. THIS IS NECESSARY to make your marriage legal. The officiant will ask if you will accept each other as partners for life. This is necessary because the officiant is acting similar to a judge or clerk. Your witness is there to witness your promises to one another. You are basically entering into a verbal contract that will be bound by signatures later. This will then be entered into vital records.
- RINGS (Although an exchange of symbols is traditional, it is not required. Some couples opt for necklaces or even tattoos!)
- PRONOUNCEMENT (PRONOUNCEMENT is given by the officiant. THIS IS NECESSARY to make a marriage legal.) This is the moment where you will be announced to the world. Be sure to inform the officiant of the term you would like to use.
- THE KISS OF BLISS (The moment you have all been waiting for! The deal is sealed with a kiss.) Make it a long one so the photographer can get good shots.



YOU MADE IT!

The signing


- After the kiss, it may be frantic but take that moment to step to the side with your officiant and witness to sign your license.
- A lot of officiants will return the license for you. Most states require the license to be returned within 10 days. Be sure to research and get it in on time.
- Your wedding certificate will be mailed to the address listed on the license in a few weeks. Check return times as they vary from county to county. (Sometimes you may receive a keepsake wedding certificate. This is NOT a legal document.)
