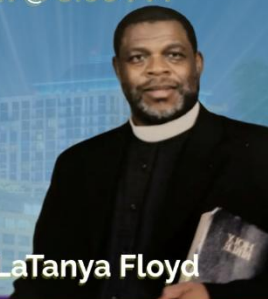

Greetings:

Greetings in the matchless name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ!

As we stand on the threshold of our 2025 District Conference, we do so with hearts full of expectation, knowing that God is moving in this season. We are reminded of His promise in **Isaiah 42:8-9: "I am the Lord; that is My name! I will not yield My glory to another or My praise to idols. See, the former things have taken place, and new things I declare; before they spring into being I announce them to you."**

This year, we boldly embrace the theme "When God Does a New Thing." During our Planning Meeting, the Orlando District came together to tackle critical issues affecting our congregations. We engaged in workshops on Church Etiquette—reaffirming the importance of reverence, order, and hospitality in our worship—and strategies to recover members who have drifted away. These discussions were not just about programs or numbers; they were about reclaiming souls, restoring faith, and rebuilding the spiritual foundation of our churches.

But our work is not done. We must keep pressing forward, keeping our hands to the plow. As we move toward our District Conference, we will continue this momentum with a renewed focus on church growth and discipleship. We are excited to introduce two powerful workshops designed to equip us for this new season:

1. Fishing Season – Bait, Hook, and Catch
"Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men." – Matthew 4:19 - The time is now! This workshop will reignite our passion for evangelism, teaching us how to meet people where they are, speak to their needs, and bring them into the fold of Christ with wisdom, love, and authenticity. Too many souls are being lost because we have not cast our nets wide enough. We must learn how to fish for souls in a way that is intentional, compassionate, and effective.



2. Evangelism in an Online World & Evangelism in an Online Environment - **"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."** – Matthew 28:19

The digital space is now a mission field, and we can no longer afford to ignore it. This workshop will equip us with the tools to spread the Gospel beyond the walls of our sanctuaries, reaching people through online ministries, social media, and virtual discipleship. The church must adapt without compromising the message—and this training will show us how.

A Season of Healing and Hope - This is not just another conference. This is a divine appointment. The Black Church has long been a place of refuge and revival, and now, more than ever, we need to reclaim that mantle. We must be healers in our communities, bridges of faith, and champions of justice and love for all mankind.

As we gather, let us do so with a spirit of unity, urgency, and unwavering hope, that makes us not ashamed. Let us encourage one another, lift each other up, and be reminded of God's promise: **"Behold, I will do a new thing, now it shall spring forth; shall ye not know it? I will even make a way in the wilderness, and rivers in the desert."** – **Isaiah 43:19**. Family, God has already made a way. It's time for us to step into it.

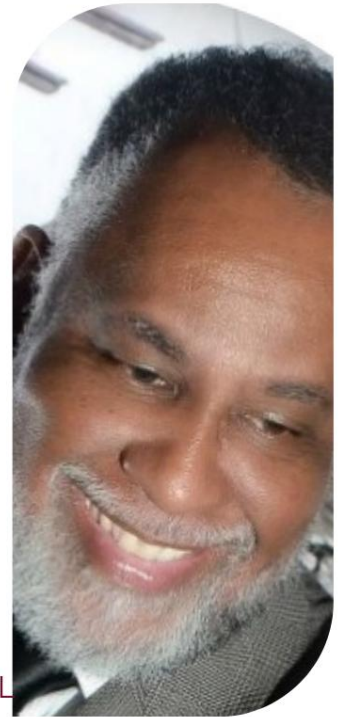

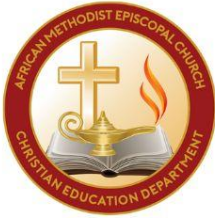

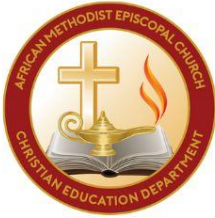

Key Themes and Learning

Outcomes:

- **Adapting to Cultural and Technological Shifts:**

Engagement now drives attendance. Digital platforms are a primary space where people seek answers to spiritual questions. The church must embrace online spaces as part of its mission field.

- **The Biblical Mandate for Digital Evangelism:** Jesus commanded us to go and make disciples*—this includes the online world. The internet connects people across nations, mirroring the Great Commission. The church should proactively seek out people where they are—both physically and digitally.

- **The Role of Online Engagement in Church Growth:**

Churches need both a social media plan (promotion) and a social ministry strategy (discipleship). Digital discipleship expands ministry beyond Sunday services. A paradigm shift is necessary: The church must transition from attracting people to engaging them.

- **The Reality of a Post-Christian Society:** Fewer people are attending in-person services. A growing number of people identify as atheist or agnostic. Churches must embrace hybrid models to remain relevant and impactful.

- **Practical Digital Ministry Strategies:** Using websites and social media to foster community and discipleship. Encouraging members to be digital missionaries by engaging in conversations online. Shifting from just sharing content to actively making disciples.

Bio:

Rev. Dr. Marcellus Alexander Norris was born in Newark, NJ to Bishop Richard F. and Mrs. Mary Ann Norris. Rev. Norris is married to Mrs. Anethia Theress Norris and have two sons, London Nicholas and Marcellus Alexander II.

Dr. Norris accepted the call to preach on August 6, 1995 at St. Matthew A.M.E. Church, Philadelphia, PA, where then Rev. Richard F. Norris was the pastor. He preached his trial sermon on September 24, 1995 and received the license to preach on September 25, 1995. A third generation A.M.E. preacher, Marcellus graduated in May 2007, from Lutheran Seminary at Gettysburg with a Master's of Divinity Degree. On May 14, 2021, Dr. Norris earned his Doctor of Ministry degree from Payne Theological Seminary, Wilberforce, OH.

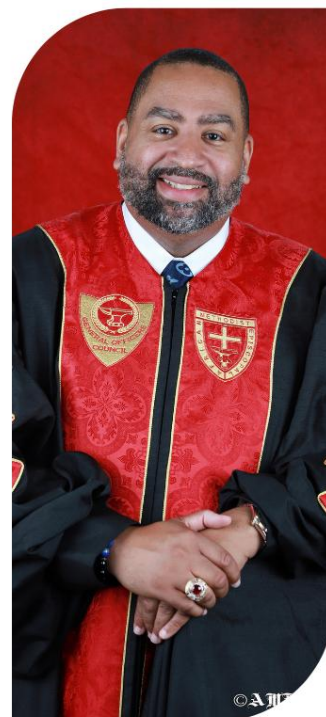
Dr. Norris has pastored the following churches: Bethel A.M.E. Church, McConnellsburg, PA, St. Peters A.M.E. Church, Shippensburg, PA, Bethel A.M.E. Church, West Chester, PA, Bethel A.M.E. Church, Bryn Mawr, Pa, Bethel A.M.E. Church, Norwalk, CT, & St. Paul A.M.E. Church, Cambridge, MA.

On January 22, 2012, Dr. Norris was assigned by Bishop Richard F. Norris to St. Luke A.M.E. Church, New York, NY. Rev. Norris came in and hit the ground running with a Vision and a Ministry of Excellence for St. Luke. Pastor Norris introduced to St. Luke, the "E" Factor, which constitutes the Principles of Excellence. Under his leadership, he was able to stabilize the finances of the church by paying off one loan in two years. Since St. Luke loves to travel the world to worship and evangelize, Rev. Norris and St. Luke purchased a 25 passenger minibus. Under Rev. Norris' leadership, St. Luke started an after school program in 2013 which serves over 60 children. This program expanded in 2014 by teaching the Hispanic community English as a second language.

Rev. Norris has liquidated \$1,000,000 in nine years as a testament of financial stewardship. The mortgage was burned on November 7, 2021.

Pastor Norris took St. Luke through a critical period when the roof of the church was in dire need of repair. The hairline fractures in the roof trusses made the church inhabitable. Pastor Norris led the church in a fight with the insurance company that lasted for over 2 years. Rev. Norris led the church into a season of prayer and St. Luke was awarded \$638,000 for the repairs. The roof was repaired and the church marched back into the sanctuary on November 7, 2021.

Dr. Norris served as the First Episcopal District Chairman of Christian Education for 10 years. Dr. Norris also served as the President of the New York Police Department 30th Precinct Clergy Council for seven years.

Pastor Norris is a member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Incorporated. Pastor Norris is a Master Mason and member of Xenia Lodge #50.

On July 11, 2021, in Orlando, FL, at the 51st Session of the General Conference of the AME Church, Rev. Dr. Marcellus A. Norris was elected the Executive Director of Church Growth and Development of the AME Church. Dr. Norris is currently serving as the Pastor of St. Luke AME Church, Nashville, TN.

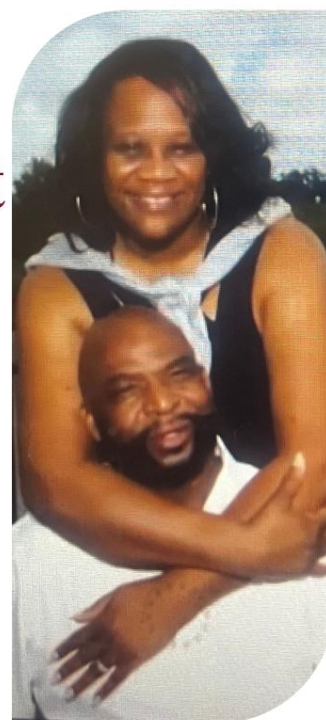

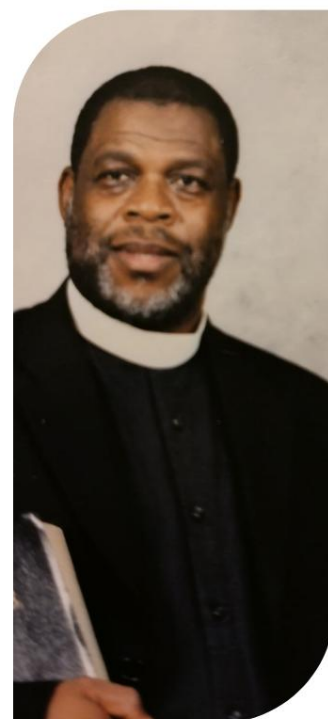
