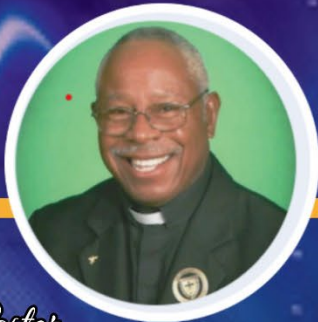

The Empowering Training Sessions will include:

- Locating Grants: Funding Sources & the Grant Writing Process
- Question-and-Answer Sessions with Industry Professionals
- Certificates of Completion and Resource Materials for Participants

This gathering will culminate in a practical application exercise in which participating churches will develop a concise proposal onsite. One congregation will be awarded a \$500 seed grant during the closing worship experience, symbolizing both encouragement and accountability as we move from vision to implementation.

As this initiative unfolds, we are prayerfully seeking resources and cultivating strategic partnerships to allow this model to mature into a broader pilot, beginning within the Orlando District. Our aspiration is to empower congregations to expand community service through responsible grant engagement.

The Reverend Robert Simmons

Reverend Robert Simmons was born on May 31, 1951, in Hernando, Florida. He attended Booker T. Washington Elementary and High School in Inverness, Florida, from 1957 to 1967, where he distinguished himself early as a fifth-grade Spelling Bee Champion and a gifted athlete, lettering in both football and basketball. Rev. Simmons was also a member of the first integrated graduating class of Citrus High School, marking a significant milestone in the region's educational history. He later continued his studies at Central Florida Junior College in Ocala from 1970 to 1972.



On July 19, 1974, he married Margaret Leaks, and from this union, three children were born: Lucinda Michele, Robert, Jr., and Matthew Leroy. He is also blessed with seven grandchildren, cherishing the legacy of family and faith that continues through generations. Following the passing of his first wife in May 2018, Rev. Simmons later remarried and now shares life and ministry with his wife, Mrs. Trina Simmons.

Reverend Simmons accepted his call to the ministry in September 1988 during the Annual Conference held at St. Mark A.M.E. Church in Orlando, Florida, under the preaching of Bishop John R. Bryant of Baltimore, Maryland. He faithfully attended the ministerial institute for five years under the leadership of Dean Rev. R. D. Daniels, maintaining perfect attendance throughout his training. He was ordained a Deacon in 1992 and elevated to the office of Itinerant Elder in 1994.

Throughout his pastoral journey, Rev. Simmons has served several congregations with dedication and humility, including St. John A.M.E. Church in Weirsdale (twice), New Hope A.M.E. Church in Summerfield, and Mt. Olive A.M.E. Church in Trilby. He currently serves as Pastor of Mt. Zion A.M.E. Church in Hernando, where he has faithfully shepherded the congregation since 2000, providing over two decades of consistent spiritual leadership.

Beyond the pulpit, Rev. Simmons has demonstrated a deep commitment to community outreach and evangelism. He served in prison ministry for eleven years, offering hope and spiritual guidance to those seeking restoration. A lifelong lover of gospel music, he is one of the three original members of *The Ovation Gospel Group*, faithfully ministering in song for more than 48 years.

His ecumenical spirit is reflected in his active involvement across the broader Christian community. He participates in the First Baptist Men's Breakfast fellowship, has been a member for eight years, and faithfully attends the weekly Prayer Band at Mt. Carmel Missionary Baptist Church in Hernando. Additionally, he serves with the Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA), ministering to middle and high school students each Tuesday and Wednesday morning. In brief 15-minute sessions, Rev. Simmons and fellow leaders share the Word of God with an average of 200 students, planting seeds of faith in the next generation.

Reverend Robert Simmons' life and ministry reflect steadfast faith, servant leadership, and a deep love for God's people. Through preaching, music, mentorship, and community engagement, he continues to inspire others to live boldly for Christ and to walk faithfully in their calling.

The Reverend Phyllis Rose Brown

The Reverend Phyllis Rose Brown is the seventh child born to Mattie Henry Rose and Willie Fred Rose, Sr. She is the wife of Gregory Brown, Sr., mother of Charlotte Brown Gonzalez, Jennifer Brown Rolle, Gregory, Jr., and grandmother to four granddaughters and three grandsons. She graduated from Apopka High School with honors. She received an Associate of Arts Degree from Valencia Community College, graduating with honors. Brown also attended Florida State University as a National Merit Scholar, receiving her Bachelor of Science Degree in Social Sciences with a minor in Communication.



Rev. Rose Brown was employed by the State of Florida for over twenty years, serving in capacities which included Public Assistance Specialist I, Public Assistance Specialist II, Public Assistance Supervisor, and Quality Control Analyst for the Office of the Inspector General. She retired from the State of Florida due to serious health problems. This intensified a journey she was on to draw closer to the Lord; to know Him, to worship Him, to seek the knowledge of why the church appeared powerless in this present age.

Brown said, "I felt a disconnection from spiritual things. I needed more of God. I was consumed by His WORD AND READ THE Bible almost constantly. I was in a desert place. I needed God; I could not find him. I understood what David meant when he said in Psalms 51:11(NKJV), "Do not cast me away from Your presence, and do not take Your Holy Spirit from me."

In November of 2008, as Pastor Gerard Moss, Sr., told the congregation to turn to their neighbor and speak into their lives, Christ spoke into hers. Rev. Rose Brown preached her initial sermon on January 27, 2008, supported by her biological family, St. Paul A.M.E. Church family, and friends from the surrounding communities.

Always a person who believed in **THE POWER OF KNOWLEDGE**, Rev. Brown enrolled in **Asbury Theological Seminary** pursuing a **Master of Divinity Degree**. Phyllis graduated from Asbury Seminary on May 12, 2012. She was ordained Itinerant Elder in the African Methodist Episcopal Church (A.M.E.C.) by Bishop Adam Jefferson Richardson, Jr. on September 27, 2012, in Daytona Beach, FL. On the day after her ordination, Bishop Richardson assigned her as Pastor of Mt. Olive African Methodist Episcopal Church in Lake Helen, FL. The church grew both spiritually and physically under her leadership.

Rose Brown is the founder of the Apopka Community Women's Conference, which was a vehicle used to award thousands of dollars in scholarships to graduating youth in the Apopka Community. She served as Christian Education Director (CED) at St. Paul

A.M.E. in Apopka. She also served as CED for the North Orlando District for many years. During the 2013-2016 Conference Year, she was appointed Christian Education Director of the Central Annual Conference of the 11th Episcopal District of the A.M.E. Church, serving in that office until 2021. She also pastored at Greater Mt. Olive A.M.E.C. in Merritt Island, FL, before being assigned to Historic New Bethel A.M.E. Church in Ormond Beach, FL, on September 30, 2016. One week after being assigned to Historic New Bethel, Hurricane Matthew, a category 5 hurricane, wreaked havoc on the parsonage, original church, and present sanctuary. The Lord used Rose Brown to lead the campaign to replace a 25-foot steeple and three roofs, without insurance or a loan. The Lord is a very present help in the times of trouble.

On October 2, 2020, God and Bishop Adam J. Richardson, Jr. appointed Rose Brown to pastor Grant Chapel A.M.E. in Oviedo, FL. Rose Brown became pastor of this charge during the COVID Pandemic; however, attendance both virtually and in the sanctuary continues to grow. Since Rose Brown has been the pastor, the church has acquired full coverage insurance, security cameras that cover the entire campus, and new air conditioning systems in the sanctuary, annex, and parsonage. In 2022, new roofs were installed on the Sanctuary, annex, and parsonage of Grant Chapel. We are thankful that God has blessed us to be able to say, "Paid in Full" at the completion of the installation. The Media Ministry has also been updated during this ministry.

Rose Brown and the Grant Chapel Congregation sought to establish a closer relationship with community churches from different denominations and ethnicities. Desiring Churches and Disciples of Christ to come together to examine and establish a new awareness of our connectivity through our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. In Black History Month of 2023, Rose Brown initiated "Community Unity Day," bringing God's People Together. We are one in Christ Jesus, and we must always remember that. On the Fourth Sunday in February 2026, we celebrate four years of meeting together in the Unity of the Saints.

Her Passion is studying, teaching, and Preaching God's Word. She is thankful to God for the multi-generational members of Grant Chapel, who have a hunger to study and grow in the knowledge of the Lord. Her favorite Scripture is from Acts 17:28 (ESV), "**for in Him we live and move and have our Being; as some of His own poets have said, for we are indeed His offspring.**" Her focus is to learn more of the Word of God every day. seeking to teach all she learns to those who have a hunger and thirst to know the Lord.

BISHOP LARRY E PERKINS

A native of Dade City, Florida, Bishop Larry E. Perkins was reared in the nurture and admonition of the Lord. He confessed his faith in Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior at the age of 16. He accepted his ministry calling at the age of 19. With a divine hunger and thirst for righteousness, the pathway was laid to continue in the ways of God.

He is an alumnus of the University of South Florida, where he earned a bachelor's degree in Business Administration- Management. After graduation, Bishop Perkins became employed with SunTrust Bank in the newly formed Management program. He was promoted to Loan Officer and achieved other supervisory roles.

Upon moving to Orlando, FL Bishop Perkins affiliated himself with Malone Memorial COGIC and served faithfully under the pastorate of the late Bishop M. L. Sconiers. In February 1988, he accepted God's new divine assignment as pastor of Mission Road Church of God in Christ, located in Oviedo, FL. Led by God, the church experienced growth in membership and vibrant ministries. This led to his God-given vision for a new edifice. The Mission Road sanctuary was realized through powerful miracles released by God. As a further testimony of God's faithfulness, Mission Road COGIC desired to add more to its existing facilities and operations. A state-of-the-art 24,000 square foot Family Life was constructed in 2007. This multipurpose facility houses, but is not limited to, a gymnasium, classrooms, offices, bookstore space, and much more. Pastor Perkins and Mission Road Church, in order to further enhance the people of God and the community at large, were fortunate to have developed many outreach programs. The Church has had very beneficial partnerships with Walt Disney Company, law enforcement agencies, city and state governments, and private corporations.

Bishop Perkins was elevated and consecrated to the office of Jurisdictional Prelate of Western Florida Second Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction at the 110th Holy Convocation in St. Louis, Missouri, on November 12, 2017. The Jurisdiction is looking forward to continuing with great grace. In 2021, he was appointed as Co-Chairman of the International Prayer Ministry by Presiding Bishop and Chief Apostle Bishop J. Drew Sheard. The goal is to help usher us into a greater depth of His holiness and invoke the hand and favor of God upon us all. In April 2025, Bishop Perkins was appointed as the Chaplain of the Board of Bishops and Co-Director of the Fiduciary and Fiscal Oversight and Accountability Committee. Additionally, he was appointed as one of the Vice-Chairmen of the Southeast Region Board of Bishops, where he will serve with Bishop Norman Harper. He is married to Lady Hattie B. Perkins, and together they have served the Lord faithfully. They are the parents of two children, Christopher and Brittany, and one granddaughter, Taylor Ray.
