


The Great Plains Chapter of Methodist



YMCA Summer Food Distribution: Grab-N-Go Volunteers Needed

GRAB-N-GO VOLUNTEER SCHEDULE 2025 Shifts: 2-4:30pm, 3:30-6ish, or 2-6pm.

2PM Gather Review purpose and process Set up banners and food Pack "Shelf stable" bags Recycle run

3:30PM Prepare outside spaces Review purpose and process Start bagging colds

Set up condiment area >(1 per family and optional) Recycle run Clean up as we go

4PM Distribution begins! Continue bagging colds Condiment area

>(1 per family and optional)

Clean up as we go

5:30-6PM Final clean up inside and outside

How It Works

- Each Grab N' Go bag includes **5 breakfasts and 5 suppers** for Saturday through Wednesday.
- Meals are picked up weekly on Fridays from 4:00pm-6:00pm (or until we run out).
- Families must register weekly. This helps you know if you'll receive food and reduces wait times.
- Meals are provided in Grab N' Go style bags for take-home use.

Recycle run

Meals must be picked up by a parent or guardian if not being picked up by the child themselves. If your child receives meals from another SFSP site (such as summer school), they are not eligible to pick up from the YMCA that same week.

Pick-Up Details (Salina Location)

- Pick-Up Location: Parking lot between 1512 Rush St. and 1600 Rush St. (Look for the YMCA flags!)
- Pick-Up Day/Time: Fridays, 4:00pm-6:00pm Special pick-up on Thursday, July 3 (Closed on July 4)
- At 5:30pm, any remaining bags will be distributed to families not on the list, while supplies last.
- First pick-up: Friday, May 23 Last pick-up: Friday, August 8


