UOCAVA (1986) & MOVE Act (2009) govern voting for military and overseas citizens. These laws impact how ballots are requested, transmitted, returned, and counted.

Why It Matters

- Domestic voting is usually in-person and supervised.
- Overseas voting relies heavily on electronic systems and remote processing.
- Weak safeguards can create concerns about:
 - Identity verification
 - Eligibility
 - Ballot chain of custody
 - Cybersecurity

What Is Needed

- Stronger transparency and accountability
- Better chain-of-custody protections
- Improved post-election reconciliation
- Safeguards that protect both voters and election integrity
