

How to Sign up to Work, and Which Positions are Available

Sign up:

Contact your political party and fill out required paperwork.

Contact the Nueces County Clerk's office and fill out required paperwork.

Take the Secretary of State's online training for the Hart equipment. Send your passing certificate to your Judge/Lead.

Request being assigned to a polling place or a Judge/Lead.

Take the County Clerk's in-person group training with your assigned team at the County Courthouse prior to Early Voting and Election Day.

Positions Available:

Elections Clerk: paid position assisting Elections Judge/Lead at a polling place.

Elections Judge/Lead: paid position leading a team of Poll Workers at a polling place. Extra responsibility of scheduling workers, transporting equipment, assigning Poll Workers; shifts and work positions, cross-training Poll Workers, resolving conflicts and monitoring that all election laws are being followed by all Poll Workers and Voters. Transports election equipment prior to set-up, supervises tear-down, and returns election equipment to the County Clerk's office. Ultimately responsible!

Elections Poll Watcher: appointed un-paid position observing polling place operations for a candidate, party or PAC.

Elections Department Ballot Board: paid position hand-selected by the County Clerk to process Mail-in Ballots legally.

Election Leaders exhibit Leadership through Codes of Conduct and Following all State and Federal Election Laws

Follow all laws listed in the Texas Election Code, Chapters 1-501 and follow the Poll Workers' Code of Conduct:

- Be courteous, respectful, patient and kind to everyone
- No political discussions with anyone, Voters or Poll Workers
- Dress: clean clothing, closed toe shoes, nothing political, no shorts
- No food or drink in front of Voters
- Voters are not allowed to use their phones, neither are you
- Adhere to your required work schedule. Be on time, every day.

As a Leader, set the example for all other Poll Workers. When you do this, we have the best chance of a secure and legal election.

The Judge/Lead has Extra Responsibilities

- Securely transports election equipment in their car to the Polling Place (hint: empty your car first, park your car in your garage, don't drive around a lot with the equipment, and get the equipment to a secure place within the Polling Place ASAP)
- Calls in and/or texts the closing numbers to Election Department
- Makes decisions in troubling situations
- Ultimately responsible for making sure that proceedings are legal

Recommendations to the Judge/Lead

- Buy a signature stamp! Otherwise, your time will be taken up hand-signing blank ballots on Election Day rather than dealing with more important issues
- You can designate a Poll Worker to use this stamp

The Judge/Lead Assigns Poll Worker “Positions”: Cross-train!

If you have adequate staff, this is ideal:

1. Poll Worker greets Voters, informs of cell phone laws, does “triage”
2. Poll Worker operates E Pollbook
3. Poll Worker operates Controller
4. Poll Worker observes Voters scanning their ballots
5. Poll Worker assists Voters with paperwork
6. Poll Worker observes Voters while voting; offers help if needed

Judge/Lead is Responsible for Coordinating Setting Up and Tearing Down the Polling Place

- **Judge/Lead will inform team when both take place**
- **Setting up: tape informational paperwork on the check-in table**
 - **Set up a separate table for Voters to fill out paperwork**
 - **Set up the large folding poster on another table, and display sample ballot there**
 - **Set up the handicapped “booth” near the check-in table**
 - **Set up the Scanner near the exit but within sight of Poll Workers**
 - **Think about the “flow” of Voters entering and exiting: tape signs**

Judge/Lead Utilizes the Supply Box

- **Elections Department issues a supply box to each Judge/Lead, including:**
 - Forms
 - Indoor signs
 - Tape (only use clear tape or painter's tape, not duct tape, which leaves a sticky residue)
 - Paper clips
 - Pens and styluses
 - Extension cords
 - Scissors
 - Tacky finger
 - Scratch pad
 - It does not include a hammer or shovel for putting signs into the ground, a stapler, or small envelopes. Bring in baggies and more paper clips.

Cage is Delivered Before Set-up to Polling Place

- Judge/Lead is responsible for contacting the manager of the Polling Place to coordinate entry and time of set-up
- Judge/Lead may or may not be given a key to the Polling Place and is responsible for coordinating daily entries and exits
- Judge/Lead is responsible for confirming cage delivery has occurred
- Judge/Lead is responsible for confirming the rules of operating elections on the property: whether outside signs, indoor equipment, where bathroom facilities are located, etc.

Persons Allowed in Polling Place

- Judge/Lead & Poll Workers
 - Voting system technician
 - The Secretary of State
 - Staff member of the Elections Division of the Office of the Secretary of State
 - Poll Watcher
 - State Inspector
 - A person admitted to vote
- A child under 18 years of age with a parent who is voting
 - A person providing assistance to a Voter
 - A person accompanying a disabled Voter
 - A special police officer appointed by the Presiding Judge/Lead
 - A county election official

Judge/Lead Manages Interaction with Poll Watchers

- If Poll Watcher arrives, Judge/Lead Calls Nueces County Elections Department
- Poll Watcher presents Judge/Lead with **Certificate of Appointment** and training certificate
- Judge/Lead puts these in **Daily Folder**
- Judge/Lead has Poll Watcher take an **oath**
- Judge/Lead reminds Poll Watcher **not to use wireless** in polling place.
- Judge/Lead gives Poll Watcher a **name tag** to wear
- Poll Watcher **can sit or stand close enough to hear and see Poll Workers** conducting business
- Poll Watcher may make written notes
- Poll Watcher can not work as a **Poll Worker** while **Poll Watching**
- Poll Watcher can only point out observed irregularities or law violations to **Judge/Lead**.
- Poll Watcher can only speak to Judge/Lead, unless Judge/Lead allows a Clerk to speak with them
- Poll Watcher can not watch Voter vote unless Voter is being assisted by Poll Worker
- Poll Watcher can follow Judge/Lead returning election equipment to Nueces County Elections Department at close of Early Voting and/or Election Day

Types of Ballots: When and How They're Used

Types of Ballots we deal with at the polling place:

Regular Ballot: vote on every Federal, State, City, County race pertinent to Voter's precinct

Ballot by Mail: same as Regular Ballot, but it's a **paper** ballot mailed to Voter and returned by mail. It must be surrendered to Judge/Lead if Voter wants to vote a regular ballot at the polling place. Must be canceled by Elections Department for Voter to vote at the polling place.

Provisional Ballot: offered when Voter doesn't have Ballot by Mail to surrender, or can't or won't present sufficient identification for a regular ballot, or for numerous other reasons discussed later in this presentation

Types of Ballots that are only handled by Kara's office: Restricted, Limited and Military Ballots

Ballots by Mail

Ballots by Mail were originally provided only to soldiers who were away from home, fighting a war.

Over decades, it has expanded to anyone who is away from their home when voting is taking place, and expanded to those that have or claim disabilities that cause them not to be able to vote in person.

Process starts with Voter requesting an application for Ballot by Mail from the Nueces County Elections Department before the advertised deadline of each election.

Voter fills out the Ballot by Mail application and returns it to the Elections Department.

Voter has choices when filling out the application: to request it for just one election and its' runoffs, or to request it for the whole calendar year. If Voter doesn't select one of those, the Elections Department will usually select "Annual" for Voter.

More Ballots by Mail

When Ballots by Mail are ready to be sent out for the specified election, the Elections Department sends them out to those who requested them and were approved to receive them.

A completed Ballot by Mail CAN'T be “dropped off” at any polling place. It must be mailed. Voter may hand deliver it to County Clerk’s office on Election Day ONLY.

When a Voter surrenders the Ballot by Mail at the Polling Place, the Judge/Lead calls the Elections Department, who then cancels the ballot so that the Voter can vote a regular ballot. The Judge/Lead (or a designated Election Clerk) then uses the red pen to draw a line through every page of the Ballot by Mail and accompanying paperwork that came with it. After calling the Elections Department and confirming the Ballot by Mail was canceled, Voter is processed through the Poll Pad, and votes a regular ballot. (But sometimes the cancelation isn’t immediate. Take the Voter’s phone number and contact them when the cancelation goes through.)

The Ballot by Mail, and the form/log for the Ballot by Mail, go in the Ballot by Mail canvas bag. This bag is locked up in the “cage” overnight, and is secured by a zip tie.

If Voter surrenders Ballot by Mail

- Voter fills out sections 1 & 3 on the Request to Cancel Ballot by Mail. Judge/Lead completes and signs
- Call Nueces County Elections Department to cancel the ballot
- Upon confirmation that the Ballot by Mail has been canceled, process Voter normally on the Poll Pad and Controller, issuing access code to allow voting a regular ballot

Instructions for Deputy Early Voting Clerk or Election Judge:

Top Box to be Completed by Election Official and Voter

1. Complete the top box labeled, "This Section Must Be Completed by Every Voter."

Include all the required information:

- Printed name of voter as it appears on the List of Registered Voters
- Name of Election
- Date of Election
- VUID number as it appears on the List of Registered Voters

2. Direct the voter to sign the top box on the "Signature of Voter" Line.

3. Ensure that all information is complete including the required VUID number.

Instructions for Completion of Affidavit by Voter

4. Determine which affidavit the voter should complete.

5. If voter has possession of the mailed ballot, Notice of Improper Delivery or a Notice of Surrendered Ballot, ensure that the voter signs the affidavit labeled "Voter Has Mail Ballot, Notice of Improper Delivery or Notice of Surrendered Ballot." [84.032(d)]

- After the voter signs the affidavit and surrenders the mailed ballot, Notice of Improper Delivery or Notice of Surrendered Ballot, the voter is entitled to receive a regular ballot.

6. If the voter does not have possession of the mailed ballot, Notice of Improper Delivery or the Notice of Surrendered Ballot, the voter must sign the affidavit in the box labeled, "Voter Does Not Have Mail Ballot, Notice of Improper Delivery or Notice of Surrendered Ballot." [63.011(a-1)]

- Once the voter signs the affidavit, he or she may only be given a Provisional Ballot.
- Please ensure that the voter completes all the necessary information on the Affidavit of Provisional Voter before issuing the Provisional Ballot.

All information must be completed so that the appropriate voter's Application for Ballot by Mail or Federal Post Card Application can be cancelled.

Many Provisional Voters are Ballot by Mail Voters who have no Ballot by Mail to Surrender

But, according to the SoS form, a Provisional Voter is also a person:

- whose name does not appear on list of registered Voters, or
- does not present valid Voter registration card, or
- cannot be verified through Voter Registrar's office, or
- who possesses an acceptable form of ID but does not have it with them, or
- who does not have a form of supporting ID with them and does not choose to retrieve one and vote later, or
- who is registered to vote but is attempting to vote in a precinct other than the one in which Voter is registered **(DOESN'T APPLY TO NUECES: WE VOTE COUNTY-WIDE)**
- who is on the list of registered Voters, but whose residence address is outside the political subdivision in which Voter is presenting to vote. **(DOESN'T APPLY TO NUECES: WE VOTE COUNTY-WIDE)**

**Judge/Lead directs Voter to fill out Provisional Voter envelope completely.
(This is a picture of an old form. It's now a Felony to vote for an election if
you're not eligible.)**

Processing Provisional Voters on the Poll Pad

- If you can run the Voter's ID on the Poll Pad, select "Process Provisionally"
- Select reason for Provisional Ballot from menu
- If successful, you get a DRE code to put on the green envelope

Processing Provisional Voters on Controller

- Select **Create Access Code**
- Choose correct precinct and select OK
- Select **“Mark as Provisional”** and print access code
- Access code will be a very long code, with the top half being the code and the bottom half being the part that you have to cut off and put in the white secrecy envelope along with the Voter’s Provisional Ballot
- Voter prints their name and signs the bottom part of the access code where indicated
- Separate top and bottom parts of access code, giving the **top part** to the Voter to begin voting
- **If Voter’s name can’t be pulled up on the Poll Pad, you don’t get a DRE that you can scan and put on the Provisional paperwork’s green envelope. Issue an extra access code and proceed, and document.**

Provisional Voter – Finishing paperwork

- Voter places signed portion of the access code AND FOLDED BALLOT in the white secrecy envelope, and seals it
- Voter places **white** secrecy envelope in **green** envelope then seals green envelope
- Judge/Lead adds Voter to “List of Provisional Voters” on the form provided in the Provisional Voters canvas bag
- Judge/Lead informs Voter that they have 5 days to appear at county courthouse to resolve their issue to make their vote count

Curbside Voting: What's new?

Now we make **2 trips for curbside voting**: First we deliver an affidavit/form for curbside Voter to sign, affirming they are physically unable to enter the polling place without personal assistance or likelihood of injuring their health, and that they are requesting to vote curbside. Once the affidavit is signed, Poll Worker returns inside to the Poll Pad and uses Voter's photo ID to check Voter in on the Poll Pad. **This gives Poll Workers additional time to verify the photo of the Voter.**

If Voter refuses to sign the Curbside Voter Statement, Voter will not be able to vote curbside. Voter can still vote inside. Voter cannot vote provisionally curbside.

The individual accompanying a Voter is eligible to vote curbside without also completing a Curbside Voter Statement. HB 521

Additional passengers are not eligible to vote curbside unless they sign the Curbside Voter Statement. HB 521

Curbside Voting: More of “What’s new?”

To the person transporting the Voter(s), we must ask if they have simultaneously transported 7 or more Voters during the early voting period (and on election day). If they have, they must sign a form that contains their name and address and whether the person is providing more assistance. **Not filling out the form is a Class A Misdemeanor for the transporter.**

If the Voter’s transporter refuses to sign the form for transporting 7 or more curbside Voters, the Voter can still vote curbside, if Voter signs the Curbside Voter Statement.

If a Voter is unable to sign their name or is unable to make a mark on the Curbside Voter Statement, anyone in their car can act as that Voter’s witness, providing their printed name, signature, and residence address.

A person that provides transportation to 7 or more curbside voters to the polling place during early voting and on election day must complete and sign this form. Curbside Voting: Review

If Voter is physically unable to enter polling place **without assistance or likelihood of injury to their health**, election official may, at Voter's request, deliver a DUO for Voter to vote at the designated curbside voting location.

- Following new laws, require Voter to sign an **affidavit curbside** before election official delivers the DUO for Voter to vote. Get Voter's photo ID.
- Return to polling place with **Voter's affidavit and photo ID**, process on Poll Pad, signing "Curbside" for Voter on Poll Pad.
- Get **access code** from Controller, then enter access code into a **DUO**.
- Remove DUO when it says "**Insert Paper to Continue**".
- Insert DUO in DUO GO, and insert paper in DUO GO printer **while still plugged in** (for maximum power to load the paper).
- Take DUO Go, Voter's ID, Poll Pad receipt and **secrecy folder** to the car.
- Have Voter **sign Poll Pad receipt, give Voter their ID, and position the DUO Go on Voter's lap to vote. Do not leave until Voter has voted.**
- When Voter finishes voting, ask Voter to **verify** that the printed ballot is correct. Place Voter's printed ballot and Poll Pad receipt in secrecy folder.
- Ask Voter their preference on who scans it: you, their assistant, or offer that the assistant observe the scanning.
- Return to Polling Place, scan Voter's ballot, re-seat the DUO back in the booth, and lock it in place.

Voter may be assisted by a person of their choice.

Follow new laws regarding number of election officials delivering curbside service: on **Election Day, 2 election officials** deliver to curbside, **if 4** election officials are working there. During **Early Voting, only 1** is required.

Even More Curbside Voting: New Procedures

If 4 or more election officers are present at the polling place - 2 election officers – preferably from different parties - must deliver a ballot to the curbside Voter. **SoS says 2 election officers MUST deliver the ballot on Election Day, and only 1 during Early Voting.**

No loitering or electioneering during the voting period within 100 feet of an outside polling place entrance **or within 20 feet of a designated curbside voting parking space.**

Must have a sign (large font/easily readable) that says electioneering is prohibited within 20 feet of the curbside voting space. The SOS says to **measure 20 feet from the end of the curbside parking space**, and place the additional distance marker sign there.

CURBSIDE VOTING SPACE

Voters Using Interpreters for Assistance

- Voter may select an interpreter who is **not the Voter's employer, an agent of Voter's employer, or an officer or agent of a labor union to which Voter belongs**
- An interpreter may interpret for any number of **Voters**
- For each Voter, the interpreter must take the **Oath of Interpreter**

Assisting Voters and New Applicable Laws

An election officer who delivers a ballot to a curbside Voter can not provide assistance in marking the ballot, unless they sign the Election Worker Assistance Sheet – for every Voter assisted!

Election Worker Assistance Sheet is public information. However, SB 1540 amended Election Code by adding confidentiality protections for a current or former election official, volunteer, or designee of an election official. If you want to protect your personal information from being disclosed while responding to public information requests, fill out Form 21-19 Request for Confidentiality Under Texas Government Code.

ASSISTING A VOTER: Who is Eligible for Assistance?

Voter is eligible to receive assistance in marking or reading the ballot if Voter can not prepare or read the ballot because of:

- (1) a physical disability that renders Voter unable to write or see, or
- (2) an inability to read the language in which the ballot is written

Assisting a Voter includes the following

- (1) reading the ballot to the Voter, or
- (2) directing the Voter to read the ballot or
- (3) marking the Voter's ballot, or
- (4) directing the Voter to mark the ballot

ASSISTING A VOTER: VOTER'S CHOICE

Voter's choice of Assistant must sign an **Oath of Assistance**.

- If Voter is assisted by a person of the Voter's choice, Poll Worker asks **Voter** if Voter wants the entire ballot read to Voter
- If Voter says “yes”, Poll Worker instructs the person assisting Voter to read **entire ballot** to Voter
- **No other person** except for the person rendering assistance is permitted to be present while Voter prepares their ballot
- Poll watchers and inspectors **MAY NOT** observe the assistance rendered by Voter-chosen assistants

ASSISTANTS MAY NOT INSTRUCT VOTERS HOW TO VOTE!⁷

POLL WORKERS ASSISTING A VOTER

- If eligible Voter **does not** choose a person to assist, Voter may receive assistance from 2 Poll Workers, one from each party if available
- One of the 2 Poll Workers offering assistance should be the Judge/Lead
- Poll Workers may assist because they took an oath at the beginning of Election Day
- When 2 Poll Workers assist a Voter, the **entire ballot** must be read to the Voter, unless Voter says they want to vote **only** on certain races or measures
- Poll Watchers and Inspectors **may only observe** the assistance rendered

Equipment Allowed for Use in Nueces County Elections

NOTICE

Prohibition of Certain Devices Within 100 Feet of Voting Stations



Persons are not allowed to use a wireless communications device within 100-feet of the voting stations. Additionally, persons are not allowed to use a mechanical or electronic device to record sound or images within 100-feet of the voting stations. Said devices include but are not limited to cell phones, digital phones, cameras, phone cameras and sound recorders. A voting station is the area where the voter marks the ballot.

The election judge has the authority to require persons to deactivate any such device and further authority to require persons who do not comply to leave the polling place.

Poll watchers are subject to additional rules and must sign an oath stating they do not have in their possession devices capable of recording images or sound or that they will disable or deactivate the devices while serving as a watcher.

Questions or clarification should be directed to the election judge in your polling place.

Note: This does not apply to election officers conducting official duties or the use of election equipment necessary for the conduct of the election. Furthermore, this does not apply to persons employed at the location in which a polling place is located while the person is acting in the cause of their employment.



NOTIFICACIÓN

DE PROHIBICIÓN DE CIERTOS DISPOSITIVOS DENTRO DE CIEN (100) PIES DE LA ESTACIÓN DE VOTACIÓN

No se permite usar dispositivos de comunicación inalámbrica dentro de cien (100) pies de la estación de votación. Adicionalmente, no se permite usar medios mecánicos o electrónicos que graban imágenes o sonido dentro de cien (100) pies de la estación de votación. Dichos dispositivos incluye pero no se limite a teléfonos celulares, teléfonos digitales, cámaras, celular con cámara, y grabadoras. La estación de votación es el área donde el votante marca su boleta.

El juez de la elección tiene la autoridad de requerir que personas desactiven el dispositivo y la autoridad de requerir que personas que no cumplan con esto, abandonen el área.

Los Observadores Electorales están sujetos a reglas adicionales y deberán firmar un juramento declarando que no tienen en su persona dispositivos con capacidad de grabar imágenes o sonido, o que los inhabilitarán o desactivarán al servir como Observador.

Si tiene alguna pregunta adicional o necesita clarificación, por favor diríjase al juez de la elección de su lugar de votación.

Atención: Esta notificación no se aplica a oficiales de la elección efectuando servicios oficiales o al uso de equipo de elección necesario para efectuar la elección. Además, tampoco se aplica a aquellos empleados en la localidad donde se ubica un lugar de votación mientras actúan debido a su empleo.

CELL PHONES;

AS VOTERS ENTER THE AREA WHERE VOTING TAKES PLACE, REMIND THEM THEY CAN'T USE THEIR CELL PHONES.

IF QUESTIONED, SAY SOMETHING DIPLOMATIC LIKE:

“Excuse me, I’m not sure if you are aware that cell phone use where voting is taking place is prohibited by law.”

Using wireless communication devices within the area where voting is taking place is prohibited. Persons are not allowed to use mechanical or electronic devices to record sound or images within 100 feet of the voting stations. That includes members of the media. Devices include but are not limited to:

cell phones

cameras

sound recorders

iPads


This rule also applies to children who come with their parents to the polling station.

Members of the media are not permitted unless voting.


Unpacking and Repacking DUOs: How to Fold the Cord Inside




Setting up Election on the DUOs
