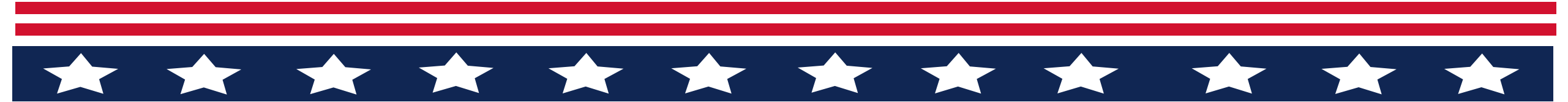

**Legislative Committee Report
Public Testimony prepared for Elections
Committee**

May 14th at 11am in Austin, Tx



I have written two legislative proposals to be submitted to the Elections Committee in Austin TX on May 14th. These two public testimonies were sent to your emails for your review on _____,

I have placed a few copies on the table if you were not able to review these prior to the meeting or did not bring a copy with you.

These two reports are being submitted electronically as public testimony from Pamela Woods President of Election Integrity Project of Nueces County.

Eliminating Annual Request for Ballot

The elimination of the annual mail-in ballot request addresses three critical concerns. First, it mitigates the risk of chain-of-custody failures caused by circumstances outside the voter's control. Second, under Texas Election Code **86.0015**, a mail-in ballot application may be presumed to constitute an annual request when the voter does not specify a particular election or indicate an annual preference. According to our County Clerk's estimates from approximately one year ago, annual applications account for roughly 60% of all mail-in ballot submissions. By discontinuing the annual request option entirely, our objective is to ensure that voters submit a separate application for each individual election. This approach removes the need to assume an annual request covering all elections for that year, including any runoffs. Therefore, eliminating the need to assume an Annual request for all elections for that year including runoffs.

**Second Public Testimony: Program to increase the number of Election workers
The committee has asked for public testimony regarding this issue.**

The General Idea would be to have the Legislature to:

Enact legislation to provide funding to county election officials for advertising “Poll Workers Needed”. Advertising should aim at attracting younger Americans to become a part of the voting experience as a Patriotic Duty and Service to their country.

Legislation should supplement the hourly pay for Election Judges and Clerks by \$2 to \$3 per hour, up to the goal of \$20/hour and \$18/hour respectively. Judges should get paid for transporting election equipment, and setting up and tearing down equipment.

Enact legislation that funds training that is as extensive as two hours to two days and pays Judges and Clerks for attending live training. Judges that are asked to provide training to Poll Workers should be compensated for conducting that training.

Finally, connect trained volunteer poll workers with their respective parties and local election offices so they can begin serving as early voting and/or Election Day poll workers
