Good Evening,

As our Prayer meetings continue, we will also continue to celebrate a America's 250th birthday! If you can, I would strongly recommend watching the movie, "A Great Awakening". It tells the true story of an unlikely friendship that resulted in one of the most defining moments in American history. I also recommend watching another movie, "Young Washington. This movie portrays a young George Washington who displays qualities of honor, loyalty, and courage in defending our "freedom" for all people!

I have been asked to present three (3) five-minute devotionals that explain our Judeo-Christian roots from Genesis which launched The Revolutionary War. My presentations will consist of three (3) parts: Part 1 tonight, Part 2 on August 10th, and Part 3 on September 14th.

PART 1

I would like to begin in Prayer: "Heavenly Father, we thank You for the gift of liberty and for the enduring truths of Your Word that have guided generations. As we look back on the history of our nation, help us to see how Your divine principles of freedom and equality were the foundation of America's founding. In Jesus' name, Amen."

The Judeo-Christian concept of the belief that every individual is made in the image and likeness of God - served as the theological catalyst for the American Revolution. Found in the very first chapter of Genesis 1:27, it says "So god created man in his own image, in the image of God he created he him; male and female created he them." This doctrine established the revolutionary idea that all humans are created equal, possessing inherent, God-given rights that no earthly king can revoke.

In the 18th century, this was more than just a creation story; it was a radical political statement. At the time when the world was dominated by monarchies and the "divine rights of kings", this verse declared that dignity and authority do not belong solely to royalty. Rather, ever single person carries the stamp of the Creator. This was the exact theological premise that led the Founders to declare that "all men are created equal" and are endowed by their "Creator with certain unalienable Rights," as written in the Declaration of Independence.
