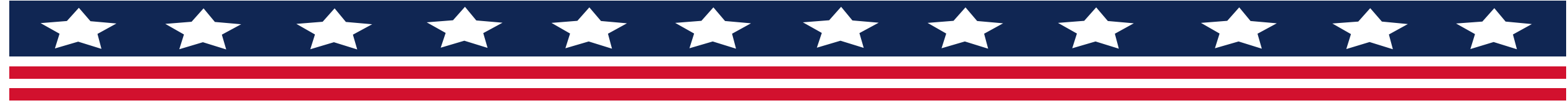

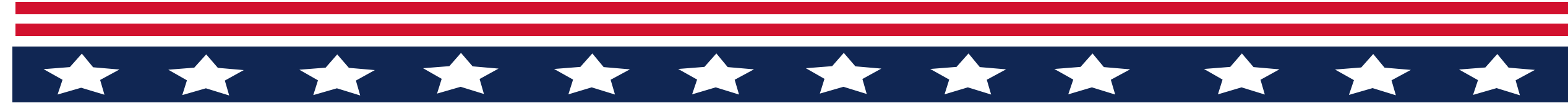

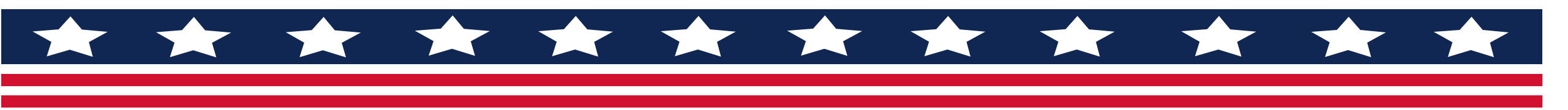

Voter Roll Maintenance Committee Report

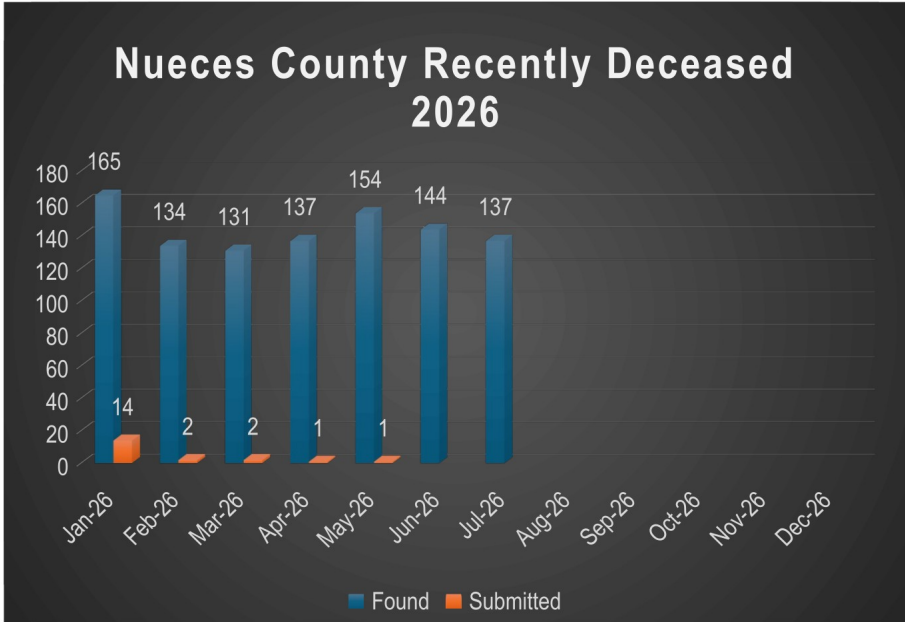
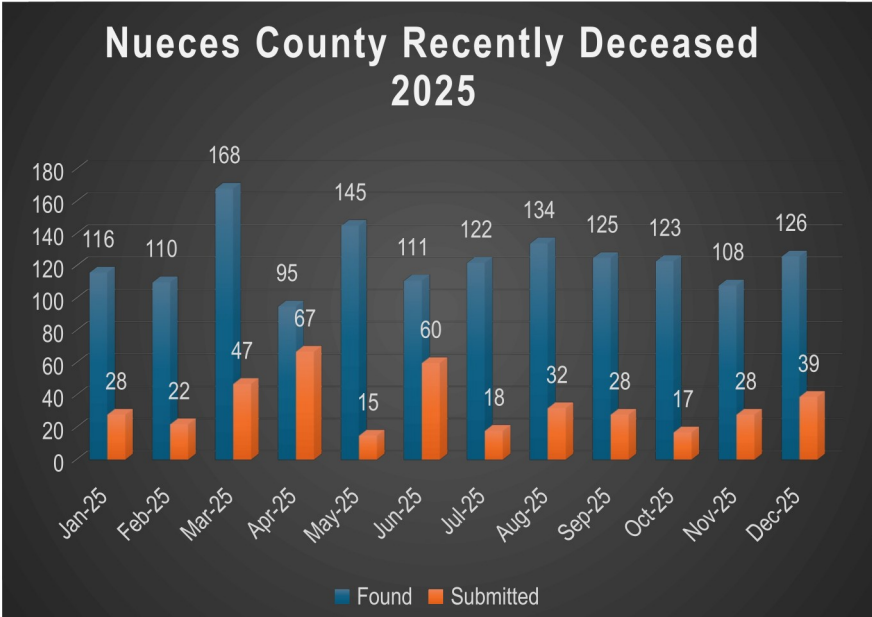
On 07/24/2026 I requested by phone and received the current copy of the Nueces County Voter Roll. I compared it to all outstanding submissions that have been made to the VR's office. Apparently all my emails including the last submissions made are not getting through to the VR's office now. All outstanding categories have been updated as of 07/24/2026.

We are working on the second mail-out campaign which is a total of 377 broken into 2 sections of 200 and 177 respectively. They are almost ready to be mailed out just waiting on postage. After asking for donations of \$800.00, we have received a total of \$130.00 toward our goal to pay for envelopes and postage.

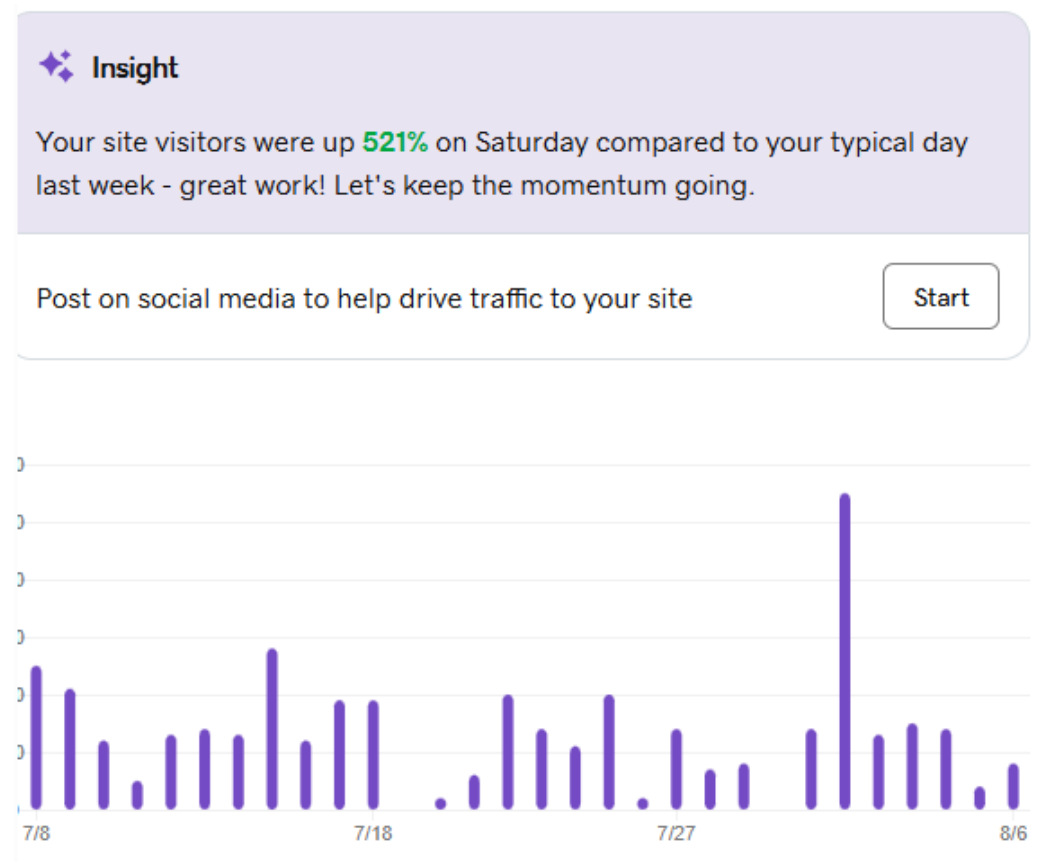
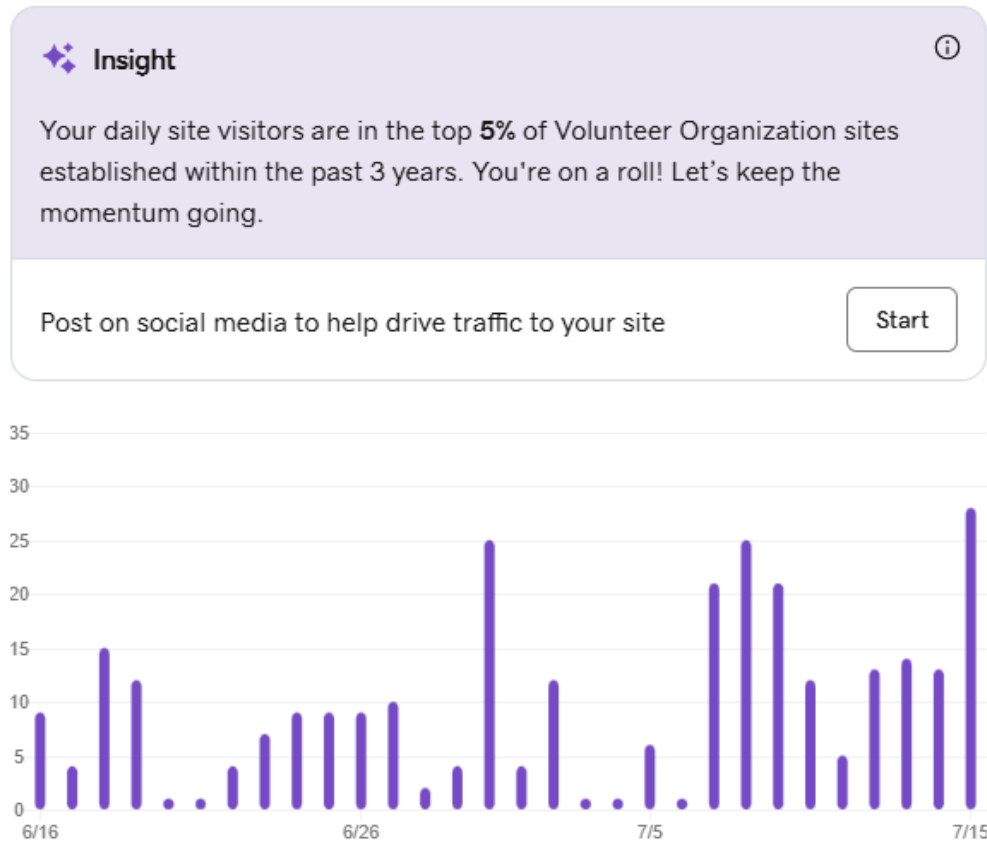
We have identified 85 voters (ineligible registrations) in ELLY for people that have moved, re-registered, and voted in another state. There is a new Beta Test report that checks voting histories between states to highlight voters that appeared to have voted in the same election in different states. We found 4 matches but of the 4 that were matched, 3 were matched to the wrong individual. One look like a legitimate double vote but the Texas vote was a Vote-By-Mail Ballot so it is suspect. We will check into this.

We are temporarily pausing the mail-out mentioned above to explore an option of getting these voters removed from our Voter Rolls without the mail-out. We will try using the correct trigger terminology, Ineligible Registration(s), instead of Moved Voters, with our next submission of the 82 MRV from ELLY to get the VR's office to actually remove them instead of placing them on SUSPENSE.

Our Recently Deceased team in 2025 averaged 33 deceased voters per month found that the SOS and the local Voter Registrar's office missed. Now in 2026 that average is less than 5 with the last 3 months submitted totaling only 5. Apparently, they have made a change for the better. If this rate continues, we will cease the Recently Deceased tracking and submitting to the VR's office. It is becoming too much of a strain on our volunteers to continue.



We have been working on getting a meeting Judge Connie Scott, and then the Commissioners' Court presenting ELLY's benefits and potential savings to the County. It will also show the CASS (Coding Accuracy Support System) address system and it's benefits.



On 08/01/2026 I gave an Introduction to ELLY training in Ft Worth to the Tarrant County Voter Roll Review committee. Two people were already using ELLY and two more signed up for ELLY access.

On 08/03/2026 I was contacted by the Republican Women of Cameron County to give an Introduction to ELLY presentation to their group in Harlingen, TX on 10/06/2026.

Legislative Report

Getting ready for the 90th Legislature: Legislation written and ready for presentation:

- **1) August 3rd EIP attended the Texas House Elections committee hearing and gave testimony of the VRM success in Nueces county. The hearing was over the problems with the Secretary of States TEAMS system for reporting election results, raw early voting and election day data, problems with the voter rolls and other issues that occurred during the primaries and the May 2026 elections. EIP provided a handout to the 9 committee members on our proposal for electing the SOS and organizing a top down, uniformed and accountable system to the SOS and then to the Elected officials of the State affairs and Elections committee. EIP also testified of the Nueces county's problems with TEAMS and due to these problems of duplications and deceased voters coming back on to the voter rolls, Nueces county stopped uploading and downloading to the States TEAMS voter roll.**
 - **While there meet with Nat Schzatline's assistant and gave her a copy of our proposed policies, we are hoping for a call back for a meeting. Nat is Gov Abbot's Director for Secure Elections.**
- **2) EIP's written policy for an Elected Secretary of State and Voter Roll maintenance structure was sent out to several Senators and Representatives.**
 - **Received a call back from Rep Brian Harrison and spent 30 minutes on the phone discussing the issue. His office indicated he would be in touch.**
- **3) Continue on our CALL TO ACTION for the SAVE AMERICA ACT. It looks like the best possible way is for the House's reconciliation budget bill which would only require 51 votes. Several Senators have given interviews and have stated this possibility. Let's Don't give up!**
- **4) The UOCAVA and MOVE ACT: there hasn't been any progress on this. Due to summer vacations and the focus on the SOS and VRM. But when Eric Flores attends on the 24th of August, we plan on asking him what he thinks is the best way forward.**

What I'm Working On

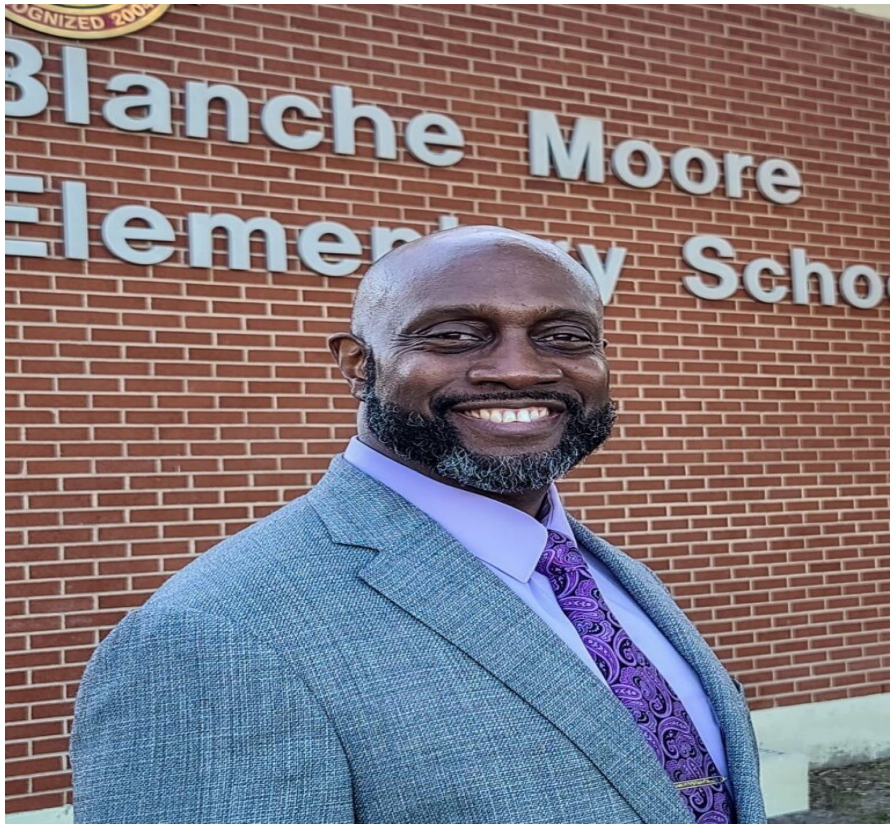
For the Corpus Christi/Nueces County Election Integrity Project, I'm diligently working behind the scenes to build a strong, informed, and connected community.
