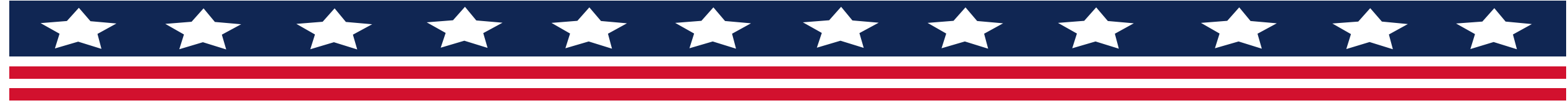

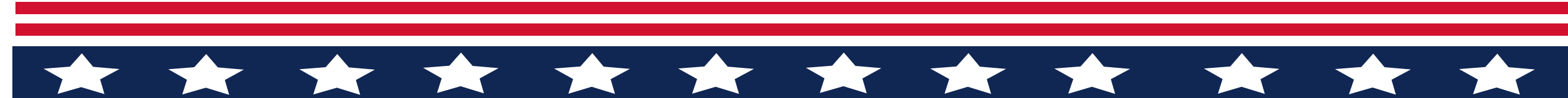

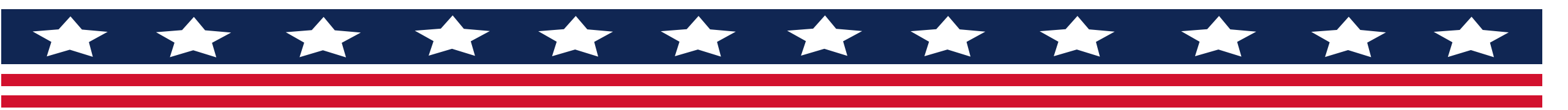

On 06/22/2026 I requested and received the current copy of the Nueces County Voter Roll. I compared it to all outstanding submissions that have been made to the VR's office. All outstanding categories have been updated as of 06/22/2026.

On 06/23/2026 I submitted the Recently Deceased Voters for 0226, 0326, and 0426 on the VR's office.

On 06/20/2026 I gave another introductory training course on ELLY at Jason's Deli after the John Birch Society (JBS) meeting. After the presentation Chuck Burnett and I discussed giving a presentation in Cameron and Guadalupe counties. Our plan is to start educating the surrounding communities about ELLY's advantages to Voter Roll Maintenance and keeping a clean up-to-date Voter Roll. The plan is to continue to give this presentation, using the target audience ELLY data, to better show the importance of Voter Roll Maintenance.

On 06/28/2026 Pam, Susan and I went to McAllen, TX and I gave an Introduction to ELLY Presentation to the Hidalgo County Tea Party. They were very interested and asked a lot of questions. I signed up 4 people for ELLY access. I am scheduled to give another Introduction to ELLY training in Ft Worth on August 1st to their GOP Voter Roll Review Committee. There will a few people from Dallas County attending as well.

We are currently working on a brief presentation to give to Kevin Kieschnick, then Connie Scott, and then to the Commissioners' Court covering ELLY's potential savings to the County. It will also show the CASS system addresses and their benefits.

At our EIPNC Board meeting on July 6 we decided to continue our Voter Mail-out campaign to Voters who have moved out of the State, Re-registered and Voted in hopes they will respond to have their names removed from our Nueces County Voter Roll. As shown below, of the 231 mail-outs in the first campaign, there are 82 that have responded to date and were taken off our Voter Rolls which is 35.5% success rate. Our original goal was 33%.

This second mailing will be a total of 377 broken into 2 sections of 200 and 177 respectively. The envelopes and labels cost approximately \$250.00. The postage will cost over \$600.00 that is why we are asking for donations to help pay for the materials. We are asking for reoccurring donations totaling a minimum of at least \$250/month after a one-time donation of \$800 to continue these mail-outs.

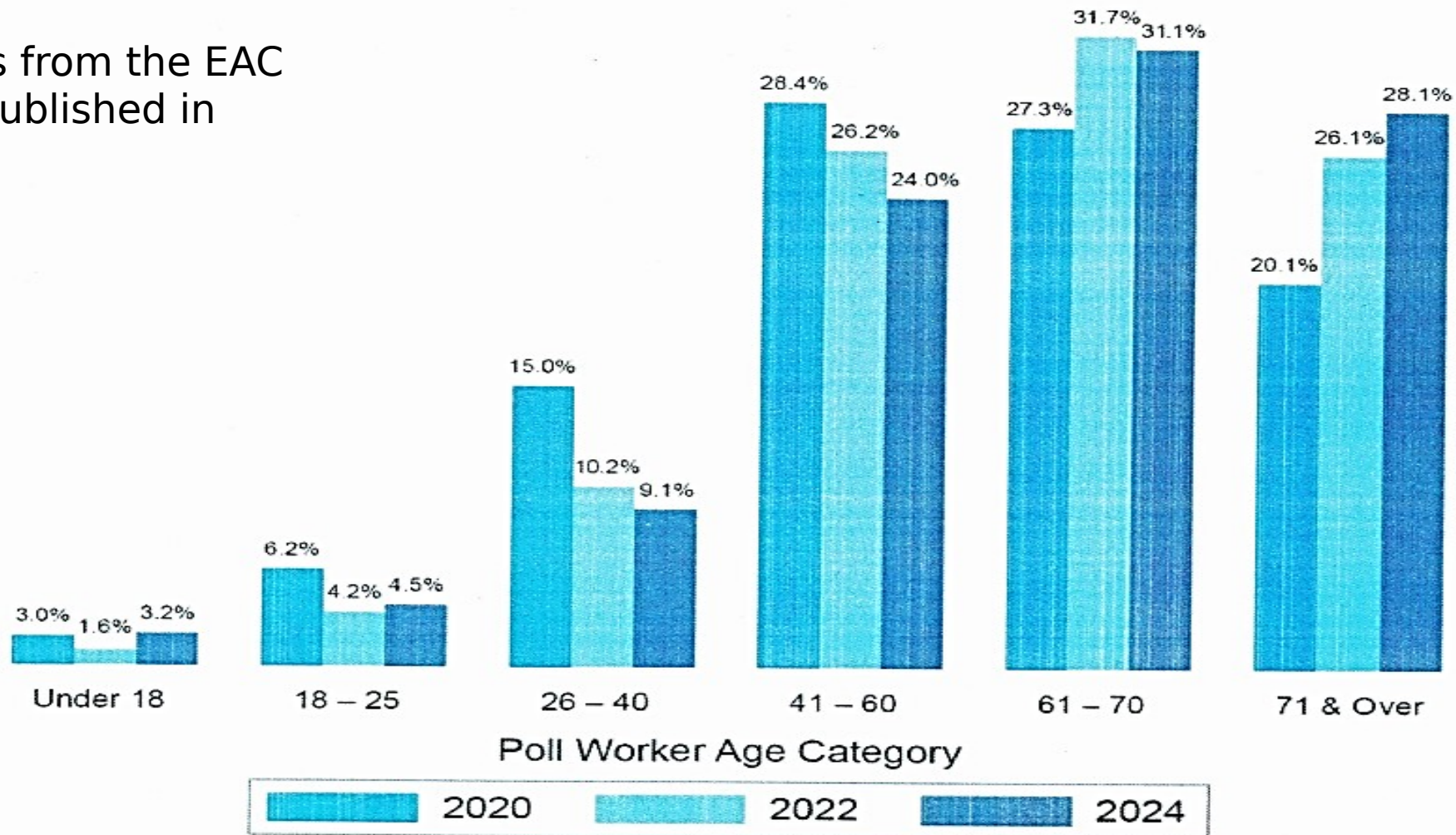
