It has been a cold December, but Facilities is continuing to work on improvements and repairs!

#### Clubhouse:

- **Fitness Room** The team is working to add a rod in the closet for hanging coats while working out. In addition, some mirrors will be added to assist with viewing the room entrance.
- Great Room:
  - Facilities worked with the Redesign Workgroup who is addressing the new paint colors for the Great Room. The scheduling of the painting will be sometime in January.
  - Blinds have been ordered for the windows above the back doors and the team is working on providing the needed electrical connections to enable remote control access. Installation of the blinds will occur after the painting is complete.
- **Kitchen** The closet door handle containing the broom, vacuum, and other cleaning supplies has been replaced and no longer requires a key. This should help with general clean-up and especially post event clean-up.
- **Restrooms** Hooks have been added to several of the single bathrooms for your convenience. In addition, there will be repairs made to the upstairs women's bathroom to fix the heater. A similar fix was made to the adjacent men's room already.

**Courts:** Court users will now find new gate doors have been added to the courts to allow for ease of movement between the courts.

**Reminders: Fitness room users**, please place the benches against the wall or in the closet to avoid accidents. **Game room users**, please ensure the lights are turned off when exiting as they are not motion sensitive and are only controlled by the wall switch.

The **November 2025** Financials have been issued and reflect the following information:

#### Overview

Year to date November 2025, the HOA had revenue in excess of the forecast by \$109,494. The year-to-date expenses exceeded the forecast by \$66,375. However, this deficit included the expensing of the prior years' operating fund balance of \$96,548 to the reserve fund balance. This results in the reserve fund's balance increased by \$96,548 while the operating fund's balance decreased by \$96,548. Excluding this non-operating expense, the result is a positive year to date revenue in excess of expense of \$107,267 as reflected by the operating fund balance, and a positive variance of \$139,667 as compared to the budget.

#### **Income Statement**

- Revenue is a positive variance to budget by \$109,494 due to HOA fees higher than the budget and timing on the working capital contribution from home closings.
- Clubhouse and pool expenses have a positive variance of \$36,317 primarily due to timing of utilities, and security expenses.
- Contract expenses have a positive variance of \$3,158 due to timing for the HVAC maintenance.
- General and Administrative have a small unfavorable variance of \$4,988 due to the start of HOA Start.
- Maintenance and Grounds reflect a favorable variance to budget of \$17,347 due primarily to lower snow removal expenses in the first quarter.
- Professional Fees expenses have an unfavorable variance of \$26,584 due primarily to higher legal expenses.
- Utilities expenses have a favorable variance to budget of \$4,925.
- Reserve expenses were higher due to the transfer of \$96,548 from the operating fund to the reserve fund.

#### **Balance Sheet**

- Operating cash balance is \$180,335.
- Invested operating cash is \$90,566.
- Reserve Funds cash balance is \$259,278.
- Accounts Receivable balance is \$7,194.
- Operating Fund balance is \$107,226
- Reserve Fund balance is \$354,385

Thank you to everyone that submitted the snow event survey after 12/14-12/15/2025 snow event. On behalf of the committee, we wanted to share following:

- There was a total of 19% out of 226 homes received with more than ½ very satisfied. Please see the below survey results:
  - 5 Very Satisfied 142
  - 4 Satisfied 35
  - 3 Neutral 20
  - 2 Somewhat dissatisfied 13
  - 1 Very dissatisfied 6
- Most noted comments of challenges:
  - Snow removal from driveways after plowing resulting in some homeowners being blocked in and hand shoveling had to commence again.
  - De-icing treatment of roads (rock-salt), sidewalks and steps (calcium) stating Shearon was applying too much.

The full committee will continue to meet monthly during snow season and we will meet with Shearon shortly thereafter with one of board members to discuss the results and how Shearon can improve.

## Transition (Sharon Fitzgerald)

The Transition Committee now has twelve dedicated homeowner volunteers assisting our community in the development and collection of Common Area Deficiency (CAD) Forms, moving us towards a seamless transition and issues.

#### Homeowner Collaboration & Common Area Deficiencies

The team and homeowners have made great progress in gathering deficiency information by going door to door and with community open house sessions at the clubhouse.

- Result: We successfully collected 109+ common area deficiencies to date. We've had three
  open house sessions at the clubhouse to assist homeowners in filling out the CAD forms, and
  there are more to come. Our team is reviewing the homeowner input for clarification of issues
  and metrics on necessary community repairs.
- Top reported issues include:
  - 32% Trees (missing, damaged),
  - 21% Concrete (sidewalks, aprons),
  - o 17% Roads / Gates / Structures / Utilities,
  - 14% Sod / Grass / Landscape,
  - o 7% Trails,
  - o 6% Stormwater (culverts, drains),
  - 2% N/A (dup and NVR warranty),
  - o 1% Courts
- Next Step: The team will continue collecting forms and defining metrics. Your involvement is
  key to this success! We encourage more homeowners to volunteer their time to ensure all
  forms are completed, providing the most comprehensive picture for the Board. Contact

#### **Risk Mitigation**

The committee is currently reviewing the updated HOA vendor Certificates of Insurance (COI's) that were a result of a detailed assessment of risks relating to comparing vendor insurance coverage against signed contracts.

• **Result:** This due diligence is mitigating potential community liabilities. The Transition Committee is working towards closing associated risks.

#### **Transition Planning**

The committee received and reviewed the Board's feedback on four Requests for Proposal (RFPs) which included:

#### These RFPs cover:

- Tree Assessment: Arborist review, inventory and planting suitability.
- Financial Audit: For the period of the Declarant Board.
- Transition Engineering & Reserve Study: Analysis of HOA assets and planning for future capital expenditures.

#### Clubhouse Redesign (Bruce Hurowitz)


After a slight pause while we waited for the results of the Community Survey, the workgroup is back to work and working on the following initiatives:

We are moving ahead with the clubhouse interior accent painting. Look out for an improved look in January!

We are adding cushions and bolsters to the existing sofas due to their oversized depth. This will greatly improve the comfort.

We have put together the drawings to convert the right half of the lower-level storage room into an enlarged meeting room that can accommodate 12-14 people. In addition, the alcove across from the Men's Locker Room will be enclosed with double doors to create a storage room. Once drawings and specifications are complete, we will solicit bids for construction and furnishings.

Finally, the Board has asked this workgroup to look into any modifications that would better facilitate the rental of the clubhouse that was requested in the recent survey. We will report our findings back to the Board.
