During September and October, the Finance Committee has had meetings with all the committees and Sophia Reeves to prepare the 2026 operating budget before submission to the Board of Directors. I also met with Joe Jensen, chair of the Finance Committee and Sophia to discuss and review the budget prior to Board submission.

In mid-October, the Board received the budget from the Finance Committee to review and approve. After much discussion the Board approved the budget. Details will be provided at the November 18th HOA meeting.

Total revenues are equal to total expenses of \$1,271,332. The monthly HOA Fee will be \$405 per month, an increase of 4.6%.

In previous budgets, the two largest unknowns were HOA fee revenue due to home sales timing and snow removal expenses. In the 2026 budget, only snow removal expenses remain the largest unknown expense. Snow removal expenses increased to \$200,000 from \$170,000 to reflect the increase in homes from winter 2025.

Landscape expense increased in 2026 versus 2025 due to increases in common ground to maintain, basins to maintain and the increase in homes completed.

To ensure that the Reserve is properly funded to meet future needs, the Reserve Contribution has increased from 10% of monthly HOA fees to 15% of HOA fees. In addition, interest income due to invested cash is budgeted to be more than \$10,000. In late October, a six-month \$50,000 Certificate of Deposit was purchased with an interest rate of 3.75%. Total Reserve Cash invested cash is \$250,000.

The Board has also approved transferring the 2024 Operating Fund Balance of \$96,548 and any 2025 Operating Fund Balance (currently estimated to be \$50,000) to the Reserve Fund. The 2026 one-time anticipated Transition Expenses of \$ 113,000 are not part of the Operating Budget and will be offset against the Reserve Fund.

The Board thanks Joe Jensen, the Finance Committee and Sophia Reeves for their hard work and dedication in the preparation of the 2026 Operating Budget.




Architectural Review (Dave Prilutski)

If you would like to borrow a puzzle, there is a sign-out sheet on the puzzle shelf. If puzzle pieces are lost or the puzzle is incomplete, feel free to keep it or throw it away. We will also consider donating puzzles if necessary. A moveable puzzle table has recently been purchased and is set up in the Sunroom.

Chair and table carts have been purchased for the existing tables and chairs. This will help our storage room organization and prevent further damage to the wall insulation.

Thanks to Dave Huppmann for his help in sealing the asphalt adjacent to the cement apron located near the clubhouse entrance. This will prevent future heaving during the winter.

Thanks to Mike Beatty who is working to see if we can install additional gates in the pickleball and tennis courts.

The **September 2025** Financials have been issued and reflect the following information:

Overview

Year to date September 2025, the HOA had revenue in excess of the forecast by \$76,452. The expenses were under the forecast by \$29,947. The result is a positive year to date variance of \$106,399 compared to the budget.

Income Statement

- Revenue is a positive variance to budget by \$76,452 due to HOA fees higher than the budget and timing on the working capital contribution from home closings.
- Clubhouse and pool expenses have a positive variance of \$26,544 primarily due to timing of utilities, and security expenses.
- Contract expenses have a positive variance of \$3,523 due to timing for the HVAC maintenance.
- General and Administrative have a small unfavorable variance of \$833.
- Maintenance and Grounds reflect a favorable variance to budget of \$11,807 due primarily to lower snow removal expenses in the first quarter and higher landscaping expenses over the summer.
- Professional Fees expenses have an unfavorable variance of \$15,425 due primarily to higher legal expenses.
- Utilities expenses have a favorable variance to budget of \$4,332.

Balance Sheet

- Operating cash balance is \$137,490.
- Invested operating cash is \$90,566.
- Reserve Funds cash balance is \$243,451.
- Accounts Receivable balance is \$10,644.



Landscape & Grounds (Scott Whittington)

October has been a busy month for the Landscape Committee. We were able to acquire roughly 50 shrubs from the NV model homes and negotiated with Shearon for a fair price to install them around the neighborhood. A shout out to Tom Schambers and Glenn Peters





for helping to transfer the plants to the clubhouse parking lot and to the rest of the committee for helping to keep them watered. The vast majority of them were used to replace poor or dead plants. You will see these plants at the Bollinger and Sculthorpe entrances and the transformer at the Sculthorpe entrance. The rest were used around the clubhouse and pool. We opted not to use these plants around the new propane farms as we have worked closely with the developer and Greenleaf Propane to get additional plantings.

Please be patient with the rest of the developer's landscaping. We are told the trees are coming in either late fall or early spring. I have already seen sod being placed on the inner hill of Eakins (if you live where the sod has been put down, please water if possible). I believe the developer has also put down some mushroom soil on the parks along Eakins as well.

Our goose group is moving forward with ways to deter the geese. There was a meeting with a representative from the US Wildlife Services and I understand it went well.

Our committee has been kicking around the idea of starting a gardening group. It would more than likely fall under the Social Committee but with ties to the Landscape committee. I am not sure of how it will all work yet, but I see members helping other homeowners with gardening questions, holding "best front yard" competitions, arranging for some gardening lectures, and providing input on beautification projects throughout the neighborhood. Please send me an email at landscapewoodlands55@gmail.com, so I can gauge the level of interest in the neighborhood.

Finally, we have 10 red flags for each homeowner to use around their property. They are for small reseeding projects and to use if you don't want your front planting bed pruned. Please pick up your flags from Sophia or Jenna.

Communications (Marc Rubinger)

In early October, the workgroup met with two potential "best fit" software vendors for full demonstrations of their HOA systems. The vendors were provided with our priorities in advance and in detail, so these demos were specifically targeted to our needs.

Within a week, the workgroup presented its findings and recommendation to the Board. Committee chairs were provided access for their areas (e.g. Facilities, ARC). Throughout, we stayed in touch with the two vendor finalists. Our preferred software vendor "sweetened" their offer and in late October, we agreed to proceed with the implementation and use of a new system for our community from HOA Start (hoastart.com).

We plan to use November and December for planning and to begin installing the system for The Woodlands in January. We will implement the system in phases, likely finishing late in 2026. Once we begin implementation work, we will provide monthly updates regarding progress and available help for new users.
