#### Hello Neighbors!

The financials are out for calendar year 2024 and the Association was favorable for the end of December by \$34k less \$3.1k for a pending propane heating invoice from Greenleaf. So, \$30.9k rolling into 2025! KUDOS to Finance Committee for keeping a tight watch on the monthly budget and reporting all variances to me in a timely manner. And KUDOS to Facilities and Landscape Committees for helping to offset the 2024 snow expenses. KUDOS too to Danella Management team, Sophia and Jenna, for paying invoices on time and timely collection of revenue from NV Homes for vacant lots.

The Board has heard your concerns about the excessive use of ice melt in some cases during the recent snow events and is working with the Landscape Committee to provide feedback to Shearon to moderate amounts and places where it is spread in future events.



It's time to think about bird guards. For those who are new to the community, we have a problem with birds building nests in our vents during spring. Keep an eye on your vents and if you want to be proactive, have guards installed. They require an External Alteration Request be submitted but we can turn around these requests within a day. The guard must be plastic, and spray painted to match the siding or be white. Contractor information is available on the community website.





## Landscape & Grounds (Glenn Peters)

Winter certainly is here. We have had a few storms and generally we have gotten through them pretty well. The extreme cold weather has required our winter event contractor to put down salt on the roads, and ice melt on walkways and driveways. While this can be a nuisance, it is critical to prevent accidents or injuries. Residents cannot 'opt out' of ice melt due to the liability risk to the community. A common complaint is ice melt on the bluestone steps and front porch. While it looks bad initially, it is completely harmless and washes away naturally with the rain. In locations where rain does not saturate the ice melt, a simple solution of water, dish soap, and some vinegar, easily takes care of the residue. Also, the ice melt does not cause extreme pitting of concrete walks. The instances where this has occurred is a result of poor concrete mix and application. We are working to see what we can do with the pitted concrete, but if it is not a trip /safety hazard we do not have many options.

#### **Transition Working Group Update**

The transition working group met and is organizing efforts to prepare for the developer transition deadlines. The team is developing an approach that includes regular and transparent communications of the efforts so the community can be informed and interact to help achieve a great outcome. There is a lot to accomplish but we are getting an early start.

Thanks to Mike Price who was able to adjust the thermostat setting for the Saturday morning fitness class participants. The adjustment lowers the thermostat temporarily for a few hours during which the class is held.

For the near term we are focused on a few projects: kitchen cabinets, pulleys for the pool umbrellas, and storage for the alcove across from the gym (fitness room). Dave Bertsch is working to test an approach for the umbrella pulleys and hopefully he will have successfully tested and installed them well ahead of the pool season!

For the kitchen cabinet, we are still evaluating quotes for the countertop and once we have gotten them, the plan is to get that project initiated.

Next, we are looking to see if we can repurpose the cabinet that was removed from the Conference Room. We would like to provide storage for the lower level in the alcove and are looking at providing cubbies and potentially hooks for coats, backpacks and other items.

Lastly, we ordered more tables and chairs to support ongoing events.

# Finance (Rell Winand)

The Preliminary December Financials reflect the following relative to the Year to Date (YTD) budget and are subject to financial audit.

For the year ended December 31, 2024, the HOA had revenue in excess of expenses of \$34,806. The operating fund balance is currently \$110,433.

Details as follows:

#### **Income Statement**

- Revenue is a positive variance to budget by \$79,418 reflecting home settlements in excess of budget.
- **Clubhouse and Pool** expenses are a positive variance to budget by \$30,187 primarily reflecting lower clubhouse cleaning, utility expenses, court maintenance and clubhouse water and sewer.
- Contracts expense has a minor negative variance to budget of \$554.
- General and Administrative is showing a favorable variance to budget of \$1,762 reflecting favorable variances in office expense and social activities expense partially offset by an unfavorable variance in miscellaneous.
- Maintenance and Grounds reflect a negative variance to the budget of \$81,506 primarily due to a
  negative variance for snow removal of \$86,942 partially offset by a positive variance to budget in
  landscape expense of \$13,561.
- **Professional fees** expense is \$1,507 greater than the budget.
- **Utilities** reflect a favorable balance to budget of \$7,000.

#### **Balance Sheet**

- Operating cash balance \$133,963.
- Reserve Funds cash balance \$171,960.
- Accounts Receivable balance \$12,995.
